BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education encourages all the schools of the District to undertake educational activities which commemorate the history and contributions of African-American citizens and that this history be included and intertwined in all studies of history of the United States throughout the school year.

7.4 Extended Field Trip, San Bernardino High School, Catalina Island Marine Institute, Toyon Bay, California
 (Prepared by Business Services Division)

San Bernardino High School requests Board of Education approval of an extended field trip for 15 San Bernardino High School students and 2 District employees to attend the Catalina Island Marine Institute, in Toyon Bay, California, February 24, through February 26, 2012.

This trip is part of the Advanced Placement Biology’s curriculum, which involves oceanography, island ecology, and marine biology labs. The students will embark upon a science adventure that will not only teach marine science and Island ecology, but will stimulate curiosity for nature and become a treasured memory.

The cost of the trip, not to exceed \$3,664.00, including meals and lodging for 15 San Bernardino High School students and 2 District employees, will be paid from fundraising and San Bernardino High School Account No. 203. Transportation to and from the Long Beach Marina will be provided by students’ parents at no cost. Transportation to Catalina Island will be provided by Catalina Classic Cruise. No student will be denied participation due to financial constraints.

It is recommended that the following resolution be adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education approves the extended field trip for 15 San Bernardino High School students and 2 District employees to attend the Catalina Island Marine Institute, in Toyon Bay, California, February 24, through February 26, 2012. The cost of the trip, not to exceed \$3,664.00, including meals and lodging for 15 San Bernardino High School

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students and 2 District employees, will be paid from fundraising and San Bernardino High School Account No. 203. Transportation to and from the Long Beach Marina will be provided by students' parents at no cost. Transportation to Catalina Island will be provided by Catalina Classic Cruise. 7.5 Federal/State/Local District Budgets and Revisions
(Prepared by Business Services Division)

Throughout the year, the District is advised by federal, state, and local agencies of program entitlements and any additions and/or reductions in funds available for already-approved programs. The following programs requested by the Board of Education affect the restricted and unrestricted portions in the budgets of the District funds. In order to adjust the program budgets, it is necessary to have Board of Education approval.

The restricted program, Tech Prep Implementation Budget (316), was included in the Fiscal Year 2011-2012 approved budget in the amount of \$8,000.00. Based on the information received from San Bernardino County Schools, a decrease in the amount of \$8,000.00 for revenues and expenditures will result in a revised total of \$0.00.

The restricted program, ESEA Title I (501/524), was included in the Fiscal Year 2011-2012 approved budget in the amount of \$32,346,116.28. Based on the information received from the California Development of Education website, an increase in the amount of \$1,516,585.00 will result in a revised total of \$33,862,701.28.

- 7.8 Notification of Mediated Settlement Agreement and General Release Rodriguez v. Rialto USD and San Bernardino City Unified School District (collectively) OAH Case Number 2011100045
(Prepared by Student Services Division)

On January 9, 2012, a Mediated Settlement Agreement was signed to resolve Office of Administration Hearings (OAH) Case Number 2011100045, Rodriguez v. Rialto Unified School District and San Bernardino City Unified School District (collectively) that was filed on September 29, 2011. The specific terms of the Agreement are as follows:

1. SBCUSD agrees to fund an amount not to exceed \$3,500.00 for an independent education evaluation to be conducted on a student by Dr. Carren Jean Stitka. If Dr. Stitka does not complete the independent educational evaluation and provide the District a copy of her report on or before June 30, 2012, the District's obligation to an independent educational evaluation is terminated. Payment to be made from Restricted General Fund-Special Education, Account No. 827.
2. Within 60 days of the date of SBCUSD Board of Education's approval/ratification of this Agreement and the dismissal of OAH Case No. 2011100045 with prejudice, the District agrees to pay an amount not to exceed \$2,000.00 for attorney's fees incurred and related to OAH Case No. 2011100045. The check will be made payable to Ruderman & Knox, LLP. Payments to be made from Restricted General Fund-Special Education, Account No. 827.

It is recommended that the following resolution be adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education approves the District to fund an independent education evaluation conducted by Dr. Carren Jean Stitka not to exceed \$3,500.00 to be completed on or before June 30, 2012; approves the District to pay for attorney's fees incurred and related to the Mediated Settlement Agreement OAH Case No. 2011100045 not to exceed \$2,000.00 payable to Ruderman & Knox, LLP. Payments are to be paid from the Restricted General Fund-Special Education, Account No. 827.

(S) A stipulated expulsion is a process whereby the pupil and his/her family acknowledge responsibility for the behavior leading to the recommendation for expulsion by the school administration, and waive their right to a hearing by admitting to the facts in support of an expulsion recommendation. The pupil and his/her family stipulate the facts of the case as presented by the school, accepting one of the following consequences: *(S) suspended expulsion, ***(S) expulsion one semester, suspended expulsion one semester, (S) expulsion two semesters.

The governing board is not required to send prior notice of the exclusion to the parent or guardian of the pupil.
