Include:

- Personal Information (Name, Address, Phone, Email)
- Education Information (High School Name, Year of Graduation)
- Activities (Name of Clubs, Dates of Involvement, Leadership Positions)
- Honors/Awards
- Volunteer Work (Name of Organization, Dates of Involvement, Responsibilities)
- Work Experience (Name of Employer, Dates of Employment, Responsibilities)

Use action verbs to highlight your skills, for example:

Acted

Established

Collaborated

Created

Developed

Organized
