Lowndes County go to the polls for the special Senate election in November on the ballot. Voters will have an opportunity to keep Lowndes County Public School System. Lowndes County Superintendent Ben Davis emphasized that these are not new taxes but a renewal. According to Davis, "These taxes are approved on a 25-year term, and this would just extend the life of the taxes."


Lowndes County has three millage rates (3 mil, 3 mil and 1 mil). Collectively, they generate \$10,000 annually for Lowndes County Schools. Lowndes County Superintendent Daniel Boyd explained the significance of the renewal, "This is the last half of our local funding. The district will be crippled if we don't renew. It would take years, perhaps an entire generation of students, to fill the catastrophic financial hole. The renewals will allow the district to provide the services our students, employees and citizens deserve. The renewals reflect our commitment to full accountability and we will continue to exercise our stewardship over these funds."
