





A-G Completion (Board Priority)

- 1. Uniform digitized 4-year plans in Aeries.
- 2. All students are placed into A-G courses that meet 4 year university admission requirements.
- 3. Robust credit recovery system- for A-G and Diploma bound courses.
- Creating support classes to reduce gaps in ELA and Math- especially in 9th grade.
- 5. Free tutoring for ALL- After school tutoring, Brainfuse online support, Valdez in person
- 6. Counselors meet with students at least two times a year.



ALL IN FOR FAFSA/CA DREAM ACT

Starting in the 2022-23 school year, high schools and school districts (Local Educational Agencies) must ensure that 12th graders complete a **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or CA Dream Act Application (CADAA).**


WHY?

All students deserve to continue their education beyond high school. Completing the FAFSA/CADAA provides access to various financial aid resources that will help reduce the cost of attendance.

WHAT IS FINANCIAL AID?

The combination of grants, scholarships, work-study opportunities, student loans, and other forms of aid to help students finance their higher education.





Early College Credit (Board Priority)

Dual Enrollment

Articulation Agreements

Allows HS students to be enrolled in their high school and at a college at the same time. These are taught by the college faculty.

- Last 4 years, SBCUSD students have taken 126 distinct SBVC Dual Enrollment courses.
- 371 students dually enrolled for 22-23



A formal agreement between a college and SBCUSD that guarantees classes completed at the HS will count for college credit at that specific college. Classes are taken at the high school and taught by SBCUSD teachers.

- 26 articulated courses
- 5 colleges and universities have Articulation Agreements with SBCUSD
 - 2,476 students are currently enrolled in articulated courses


