PLHS Health Office Update:

As we (finally!) approach the warmer months - and with upcoming activities such as Prom and spring sports - we would like to remind you about the importance of protecting skin from the harmful effects of UV rays.

Tanning beds have become increasingly popular among teenagers in recent years. However, they are not safe and can have serious health consequences. According to the American Academy of Dermatology, using tanning beds before the age of 35 increases the risk of developing melanoma by 59%. Melanoma is the deadliest form of skin cancer and its incidence has been increasing in young adults.

Sunscreen is a crucial tool in protecting skin from harmful UV rays. It is recommended to use a broad-spectrum sunscreen with an SPF of at least 30, which should be reapplied every two hours or immediately after swimming or sweating. Sunscreen is especially important between the hours of 10 AM - 4 PM, when the sun's rays are the strongest.

We encourage you to talk with your children about the risks associated with tanning beds and the importance of using sunscreen. Please reach out to the Health Office if you have any questions or concerns.
