PTA report from Emily

- Planning 8th grade celebration – food, hoping with good weather, committee of parents planning, but not specific details yet. As far as graduation, there isn't really a graduation / promotion (comes down from district). Typically, there is an assembly for students only and then an open house afterwards for parents / families. This is due to space limitations.
- Celebration will be June 9th
- Also working on staff and faculty appreciation the first week of May

SIC report from Kate Bodey

- Counseling report was shared from Anena Gardner at the SIC
- Program Spending – have spent 27k from faculty compensation (outside, after-school, performing arts). 10k from planning in the summer. 6k for Family Night
- Talked about calendar for next year and teacher comp time (move some comp time to Family Night and Back to school night). Rest of comp time towards parent-teacher conferences and how we might do that next year (maybe one per quarter instead of two nights back to back). Still getting feedback on that.
- Working on advisory. Really trying to figure out every week Friday short day. Want to get out at 1 pm. Right now, we have about 20 early releases. Want some staff feedback and talking to Hillside about how we can make that work. Work that out with SCC and SIC – write a letter to the superintendent on how we can accomplish this. Would need to be 1:30 (but the district wants it to be at 1:45 to make sure there is enough time between buses when the high schools get out at 1:45 on early release days).
- Parents also would like consistent getting out early on Fridays, not just on some Fridays.
- Still working on advisory – state says it needs to be 45 minutes a week. We have been doing 50 minutes a week (10 minutes a day). 26 minutes a week perhaps with 4 minutes of announcements a week. Getting more feedback from faculty about what that program should look like.

- Question about advisory – why thinking of moving to one long? Based on feedback from faculty / staff. They feel like there hasn't been enough time to cover a topic in the 10 minutes.

Counselor report from Anena Gardner

- Finished CCRs for the year for 8th graders.
- Working on master schedule, class requests for next year
- Groups are going – grief, voices, mindfulness
- Continuing Wed. advisory lessons, focusing on healthy coping skills

HB 58 report from Anena Gardner

- Required to give end of the year report.
- What we are doing to help students to build protective factors
- Fully implemented – voices, individual counseling, well-being team, school play, student gov., intermural sports, college & career, Clayton Cool vibes, clubs, insights, Bridge to Liberty Elementary, life essentials 101, school wide ROARS, Zen Den, SEL advisory, student advisory council, attendance committee, and more
- Partially implemented – Red Ribbon Week (fully implemented by student government, but had specifically planned to do an assembly but didn't happen due to the number of activities that happened). Might do advisory lessons instead of an assembly next year
- Not yet implemented – parent night addressing mental health, fun run, girls on the run (Ms Hazelwood was the point person – was cancelled due to injury, but didn't have more details)
