

## A Guide to MLA citing and referencing

In order to maintain Academic Integrity, it is vital that you cite and reference appropriately and correctly.

*Here's a GO TO guide to help you...*

### CITING

Whenever you use ideas, quotes or facts which are not your own, you **MUST** cite where you sourced this information.

#### **MLA citation:**

"Saturn is mostly made of hydrogen and helium" (Smith 11).

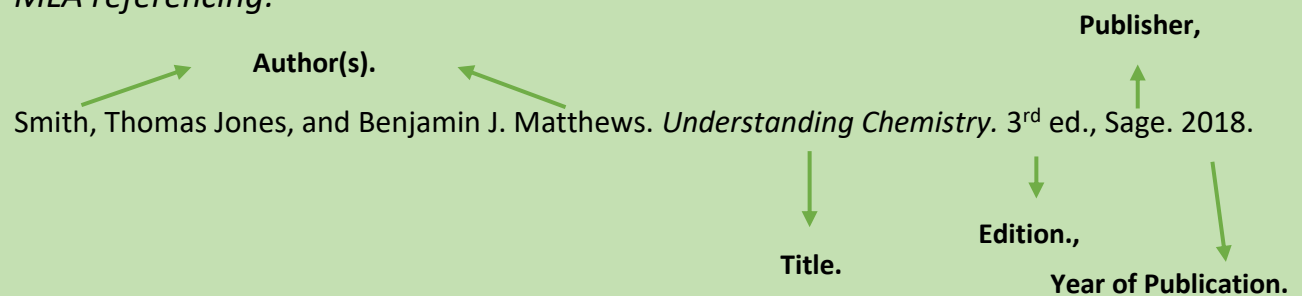

### REFERENCING

Every 'In text citing' you use must have a reference to match in your bibliography/reference list at the end of your essay. Likewise, each source you list in your bibliography must also feature in your essay.
