HVAC Information Update

The HVAC system in the new Kerr Elementary School is a more complex system than what is found in the typical home. It has the ability to cool spaces and heat others in the building concurrently while maintaining acceptable humidity levels inside the building. The system includes an energy savings automated temperature control system for which the programming is currently being finalized. Balancing of the system to be sure the required fresh air is being maintained to each space is also being completed.

Too make sure that the temperatures of occupied spaces in the building are at a satisfactory level for the students and staff while the programming is being completed has implemented the following: A daily review of the spaces by a dedicated support staff is being conducted; the HVAC Contractor and its controls subcontractor are on call to respond immediately to address any issues with the temperature that the staff encounters.

It is anticipated, that finalizing the programming and troubleshooting of the system will take another month to complete. The amount of time to perform this work is commensurate with the time it took to perform this work at Dorseyville Middle School and O'Hara Elementary School during their respective renovation projects.
