



Phases of Reopening: Critical Factors

Expanded Hybrid

- COVID-19 Activity Report is "High" or "Moderate"
- The number of cases is stable, or decreasing
- Zero to limited school site transmission cases
- Additional risk mitigation efforts allow for less than 6 feet of physical distance between desks
- Sufficient Staff to Student Ratio
- Staff identified as "At-Risk" have access to vaccine.

Current Status

- Welcomed Back Students to In-Person Instruction!
- Students will learn in-person or virtually
 - Parents must commit to a model
 - If students do not come in, they will be moved to the
 - remote group
- Wednesdays are virtual
 - Maintain current schedule during implementation

Next Steps

- Families have until Sunday, April 18th to make a decision regarding their children returning to in-person instruction via the OnCourse portal and school-level communication.
- Students new or returning to in-person instruction may do so beginning Monday, May 3, 2021
 - If students do not come in, they will be moved to the remote group



Expanded Hybrid Instruction-Final Shifts

Monday, May 3, 2021:

- Grades PK-5: 5 days beginning Monday, May 3, 2021
- Grades 6-12: 4-day model continues
 - Significant scheduling challenges did not make expanding to five days the best option at this time.
- Will remain on the morning session only schedule.
 - The NJDOH and CDC continue to recommend 6 foot distancing for lunch periods, creating challenges in scheduling and staffing.
- All staff, all grade levels, will be reporting in-person 5 days a week beginning Monday, May 3, 2021.
- The district is offering an on-site learning pod space for school-aged children (Grades K-6) of staff members on the Wednesdays.





What can you do?

- If you are traveling outside of NJ and surrounding states (NY, CT, PA, DE) please let your teacher/principal know, we will follow state guidelines. • If a student or staff member is vaccinated, they are no longer required to
- quarantine.
- If a student or staff member is not vaccinated, they must take a COVID test, and if the test is negative, they may return after a 7 day quarantine period.
 - OnCourse will continue with the 10 day language, as that provides the opportunity to follow up with the family and verify the appropriate steps have been followed. #SearchLearnServeSpringfield

- 46 new students registered as of April 11, 2021





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


Current Status


- As of today, 173 of 340 (51%) staff members have been identified as fully vaccinated.
- Our nurses are collecting information confirming vaccination status to assist in contract tracing efforts.
- Parents of students who have been vaccinated are asked to contact the school nurse so that the status can be noted.
- We are developing a process for the Fall for JDHS students to share their vaccination status with the nurses.
