



Current Status

- As of today, 244 of 368 (66%) staff members have been identified as fully vaccinated.
- Our nurses are collecting information confirming vaccination status to assist in contract tracing efforts.
- Parents of students who have been vaccinated are asked to contact the school nurse so that the status can be noted.
- We are developing a process for the Fall for JDHS students to share their vaccination status with the nurses.

Current Status

September 2021:

- All Schools In-Person
 - Any opportunities for virtual instruction related to COVID-19 health concerns will be governed the guidance and regulations provided by the New Jersey Department of Education
- Grades 6-12: We are working with scheduling consultants to review the schedules and will provide updates over the next month. We expect student schedules to be available in July 2021.
- Before-and After-Care will operate as in prior years, with adjustments based on capacity, and information will be shared shortly.





<u>Coming Soon: Safe Return to Schools Draft</u>

On or before Monday, June 24th:

- The district will share a draft document relating to our safe return to schools plan via our website and social media.
- The plan is similar to the plan shared prior to reopening in September 2020, and requires the district to identify the protocols related to health and safety guidance.
- The public is invited to provide comments and feedback on the draft plan.
- Significant areas of the plan are dependent on further guidance from the New Jersey Department of Education.
