

and have continued to smile through the difficult two weeks.


All of the staff at Sandmeier, Caldwell, and FMG who have relocated classrooms, changed plans, share spaces, and welcomed Walton students and staff.



2021-2022 Safe Return to In-Person Instruction Plan

2021-2022 Overview

- Our primary, overarching goal is to provide consistent learning experiences in a healthy and safe environment.
- The district is responsible for the health and safety of the 2,600 staff and students that make up the Springfield Public School learning community
 - Minimize classroom or school closures
 - Keep our students and staff healthy and safe
 - Provide a positive and supportive environment in a challenging time
- Policy 1648.11 "The Road Forward" is replacing Policy 1648
- Policy 1648.13 outlines staff vaccination requirements

Current Status of Schools

Since September 1, 2021:

2 Positive Cases of COVID-19 Reported

Notes:

All cases were related to outside of school transmission

It is ESSENTIAL to keep your children home when any member of the household is experiencing symptoms or if they are waiting on a COVID-19 test.

Vaccination Update

Current Status

- As of today, approximately 94% staff members are fully vaccinated.
- 97% of FMG & JDHS families have submitted the annual registration
 - At FMG 96% of families have submitted annual registration
 - 38% of students are vaccinated
 - 58% of students are either ineligible or are not vaccinated
 - At JDHS 98% of families have submitted annual registration
 - 70% of students are vaccinated
 - 28% are either ineligible or are not vaccinated
- Parents of students who have been vaccinated are asked to contact the school nurse so that the status can be noted.

How to Handle Quarantines?

- Families reporting a student is quarantined related to Covid-19 will be required to share information related to the contact with the school nurse and/ or the health department in order to be eligible to participate.
- Remote instruction will include asynchronous and synchronous learning opportunities, depending on the course
 - Physical Education and Electives will not be offered synchronous instruction
 - Asynchronous work will be accessible via OnCourse and Google Classroom
- Participation will be limited based on the quarantine guidelines set by the NJDOH/NJDOE/CDC
