Courses

All of the courses and their descriptions can be found underneath the major headings: Art, Business, College & Career Readiness, English, Family & Consumer Science, Industrial Tech, Math, Music, Phy Ed, Science, Social Studies, and World Language.

Course Descriptions

- X Each course lists the grade-level, the number of credits the course is worth, whether the course is a year-long or semester course only, and lists any prerequisites that are required before you can take the course.
- Classes that are offered for college credit have the Central Lakes
 College logo beside it.
- X Courses that are NCAA approved have the NCAA logo.
- Courses that fall underneath the Pillager Huskies Career Academies has the Pillager Husky logo.
- X If a course meets the requirement for CTE and Fine Arts it is denoted by the course name.

- X Turn to page 53 of your registration guide.
- X Print your first and last name (please print your name neatly).
- X If you have a college or career goal you may write it next to your name on the blank provided.
- X As a 9th grader you are required to take English, math, science, social studies, and Freshman Academy. These classes are *required* and will count towards the graduation requirements.

All credits count in high school! Every class you take will give you the opportunity to earn credit towards graduation. Some courses are required and some courses are electives, but each class counts toward your overall number of credits. Students need a minimum of 52 credits to graduate from Pillager High School.

- X If you have a college or career goal you may write it next to your name on the blank provided.
- X As a 10th grader you are required to take courses in English, math, science, and social studies. These classes are *required* and will count towards the graduation requirements.



Completing the Junior Registration Form

- X Turn to page 57 of your registration guide.
- X Print your first and last name (please print your name neatly).
- X If you have a college or career goal you may write it next to your name on the blank provided.
- X As an 11th grader you are required to take courses in English, math, science, and social studies. These classes are *required* and will count towards the graduation requirements.





Completing the rest of the form

With your pen or pencil you are going to check the following boxes for both fall and spring semester as these courses are required for everyone to take for the entire year.

English

- -World Lit & Composition OR College Composition I & II (CIS)
- (If you have Ms. Savage for English you are going to write Concepts of English in the blank provided)

Math

- -If you are in Geometry this year you will check the box for Algebra II
- -If you are in Algebra II this year you will check the box for Beginning College Algebra & College Algebra
- (If you have Ms. Taylor or Ms. Hutch for math you are going to write Concepts of Math in the blank provided)

Science

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-You can choose two science electives, one elective for each semester.

Social Studies

-World History OR College World History I & II (CIS)

Electives

-Choose SIX electives (3 electives for both the fall and spring semester)

Alternate Choices

Completing the registration form

- X Turn to page 59 of your registration guide.
- X Print your first and last name (please print your name neatly).
- X If you have a college or career goal you may write it next to your name on the blank provided.
- X As a senior you want to make sure that you are meeting all of the core requirements along with all of the elective requirements.



Pillager High School requires a minimum of 52 credits to graduate. 32 credits include core courses in the areas of English, social studies, math, science, fine arts, physical education, health, and CTE. 20 credits can be elective courses of your choosing and don't need to be in a specified area.

Completing the rest of the form

With your pen or pencil you are going to check the following boxes for both fall and spring semester as these courses are required for everyone to take for the entire year.

English

-8 semester credits of English are required to graduate. Please check the boxes for the English credit of your choosing.

(If you have Ms. Savage for English you are going to write Concepts of English in the blank provided)

Math

-6 semester credits of Math are required to graduate. Please check the boxes for the math credit of your choosing. If you have met the math credits you do not need to choose a math elective, however, it is highly recommended that you continue with math.

(If you have Ms. Taylor or Ms. Hutch for math you are going to write Concepts of Math in the blank provided)

Science

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-You can choose two science electives, one elective for each semester. Two science electives are required during your 11th or 12th grade year. Of those two science electives, one class needs to be a chemistry course or have a chemistry emphasis. If you have met your science requirements you do not need to choose a science elective.

Social Studies

-Economics is required (1 semester)


Electives

-Choose EIGHT electives (4 electives for both the fall and spring semester)

Alternate Choices

-Choose SIX alternate electives (3 alternates for both fall and spring semester)















Students New Enrollment

1. Go to pillager.onlinejmc.com 2. Click on "Students" 3. Enter your username (year of graduation, first initial, last name) Example: 24kstudent Enter your password 4. 5. (lunch #, first initial, last name) Example: 2114kstudent Click on "Transcript" on the left-hand side 6. of the screen 7. Under "Include Transcript Records" choose "Beginning with Grade 9" 8. Click on the "Print" icon at the top of the screen

Reading Your Transcript

- X All the classes you have taken are listed on your transcript starting with grade 9.
- X Use the "Credit Inventory" check on page 61 to check off all of the classes you have successfully completed.
- X Use your Course Registration Guide to look up classes if you're not sure what credits they count towards (Fine Arts, CTE, etc.)
- X Students who fail any of the core classes in English, math, science, and social studies will need to recover their missed credits in our STEPS program. You will automatically be placed in STEPS to ensure you are meeting all of the core requirements.
