# Committee Charges & Guidelines



The Facility Advisory Committee will make recommendations to the Board of Trustees concerning the timing, funding, and priority of capital projects over the next three to five years.

#### During its work, the Committee will:

- ✓ Tour facilities and review facility assessment information developed by district staff, engineers, and architects.
- ✓ Prioritize the district's facility and capital equipment needs for the next three to five years.
- ✓ Consider recommendations from the Vision 2030 Design Team.
- ✓ Understand the District's enrollment trends and projections over the next ten years as they relate to facility usage.
- ✓ Protect the General Fund and minimize the district's reliance on its Capital and Contingency Reserve Fund to meet long-range capital needs.
- ✓ Analyze property value trends and property tax rate implications of a potential bond election.
- ✓ Consider constructive public feedback.



# The Development of a School Budget

Board of Trustees approve three budgets (August)

### > General Fund

• Covers salaries, utilities, supplies and other day to day operational costs

### > Interest and Sinking Fund (also called Debt Service)

- Used for principal and interest payments on debt approved by taxpayers
- Debt covers new construction, major renovations, priority repairs and replacements, buses, land and technology

### Child Nutrition Fund

Self-supporting fund to cover the costs of school cafeterias

## **Property Taxes**



Property taxes, also called ad valorem taxes, are locally assessed taxes on property owned within the boundaries of the taxing unit (Clear Creek ISD). Everyone owning property pays property taxes to the school district, including homeowners and business owners.



Property is valued by the Central Appraisal Districts







The School Board votes on a tax rate annually in September



## Clear Creek ISD's Property Tax Base





2022 Tax Base = **\$32.0 billion** (before exemptions and freeze losses)

2022 M&O Tax Rate = **\$0.8446/\$100** 

2022/2023 Expected General Fund Tax Revenue = **\$244.5 million or \$6,112 per enrolled student** 









Covers costs associated with daily operations such as teacher salaries, utilities, fuel, supplies, etc.





Funds generated by bond propositions approved by local voters of CCISD
