If you are short on credits because you...

Failed a class with a 55 or higher

- Summer Academy: Runs 4 days a week for 3 weeks in July
- Credit Recovery: In the Study Center during the school year

Failed a class with a 54 or lower

- Retake the class
- External credit from an accredited school (BYU, SMCC, USM, etc)
