
Sun Prairie Schools

Sun Prairie has seven school buildings — the high school above, the Northside elementary school below, the Southside elementary school, East Elementary and West Elementary, a junior high school and a parochial school. Total enrollment is over 4100 with 1200 students in high school, 2250 in junior high, 650 kindergarten through 6 and 500 in Sacred Hearts Catholic School, which carries grades 1 through 8th. The high school and auditorium were completed 6 years ago. The Charles W. Bird elementary School was completed in the fall of 1965. East Elementary and West Elementary mentary were completed in the fall of 1966. Expansion and remodeling of the junior high will be completed December 1, 1970.

Industries

Sun Prairie is located near major transportation highways, giving it a strategic location for distributors and manufacturers. It is only five miles from the I-90 and I-94 which link the cities of Chicago, Minneapolis and Milwaukee with rapid freeway transportation.



Also, its location eight miles northeast of Madison gives it the benefits of a large suburban population and a variety of skills in the white collar lines and mechanical trades.

The building trades are no doubt the largest employers of labor in Sun Prairie.

The four largest industries in the city are: Wisconsin Porcelain Co., Oconomowoc Canning Co., Wisconsin Cheeseman who have operated here for several years. The Goodyear Rubber Co., recently moved here, occupying 120,000 sq. feet building, on a 20 acre site. Recently locating in Sun Prairie is Larson Mfg. Co., and the Medidine Corp.

Retail Trade

Sun Prairie has enjoyed rapid growth in retail trade. A shopping center was built several years ago and it now has 12 stores, a barber shop and beauty shop in operation. In addition to the shopping center, there is a super market, several small grocery stores, furniture stores, drug stores, men's and ladies' wear, floral shops, jewelry and gift stores. A number of the downtown merchants have put on new store fronts and parking has been expanded in the center of the city.

Newspapers

The Royle Publishing Co., Inc. publishes three weekly newspapers and an Advertiser. The Sun Prairie Star-Countryman, Waterloo Courier, The Deerfield Independent and The Advertiser.

The Triroto Corporation a part of the Royle Publishing Co., Inc. prints thirteen publications from Columbus, Randolph, Oregon, Verona, Watertown, Pardeeville and Madison.

Bicycles

Bicycles must be licensed. 50c buys a one-year license made by Waupun State Prison inmates. They are sold each May at the local police department.

Fire Alarm and Weather Warning

The siren sounds four times for a fire, but for a tornado warning, there is a three minute sustained blast. The all-clear signal is a series of four 25 second blasts alternated with five second lulls.

Capehart

A former Federal Housing Base for Truax Field has been phased out by the Military Authority. The base consists of 280 units. The Army has retained 110 units and the balance of the units to be disposed of by the Authority.

Recreation Program

Each summer the City of Sun Prairie sponsors a Summer Recreation Program. A staff of trained counselors is present daily, Monday through Friday from early June until mid-August to supervise a program of



games and handicraft for both boys and girls. Hours of supervision are from 9 a.m. to 12 noon and 1:00 to 4:30 p.m.

Activities are held at Angell Park and Wetmore Park. In the winter skating rinks are maintained in many city locations.

Swimming Pool

Sun Prairie's beautiful swimming pool is one of the city's greatest recreational assets. The pool was built jointly by the Sun Prairie Volunteer Fire Department and the City, with the gratefully acknowledged assistance of various local contributing organizations.

The L-shaped heated pool is of concrete construction, built on a one acre site in Angell Park and will accommodate 396 people at one time. It has complete check room and shower facilities. The city recreation department manages the pool and maintains at least two lifeguards on duty during all open hours. The pool opens in June and closes on Labor Day. Weekday mornings are devoted to children's swimming classes, with certain evenings reserved for adult swimming instructions.

Midget Auto Races

The Sun Prairie Volunteer Firemen operate Midget Auto races at Angell Park from Memorial Day through Labor Day each year. These races feature some of the top rated drivers in the country, and are a source of revenue for the firemen who contribute to youth activities in the area. Races held on Sunday nights.
