



*Number Enrolled in CTE Programs as a Percent of all Juniors and Seniors in Component District High Schools




Status of Career and Technical Education (CTE) Students 2020-21 Placement Outcomes

■2020-2021 All Graduates (General Education and Students with Disabilities) ■2020-2021 Students with Disabilities




Test Assessing Secondary Completion Leading to TASC For CTE Students Age 16-18 2021-2022

Alternative Education

BOCES operates full-day and/or half-day programs for general-education students who have been identified as having special needs not being met in school district programs. Programs may include academics, vocational skills, work-study, specialized activities or a combination of these. Adult Basic Education

Based on data reported for the National Reporting System (NRS) for adult education programs, enrollment in adult basic education programs for 2021-2022 was 733.

Educational Gain

Under the NRS, educational gain is the primary goal for students in adult beginning/intermediate programs, adult secondary (low) programs, and in English for speakers of other languages programs. Students are counted as achieving educational gain if they exceed established reference points in their standardized test scores between enrollment and retesting.

Special Education Enrollment and Tuition

- ❖ 12 students per teacher plus 4 paraprofessionals (12:1+1:3)
- ❖ 8 students per teacher plus 1 paraprofessional (8:1:1)
- ❖ 15 students per teacher plus 1 paraprofessional (15:1:1)
- 6 students per teacher plus 2.5 paraprofessional (6:1:2.5)


