7th Grade Math Update

Mrs. Gieseke & Mrs. Taylor's class just finished their probability unit. Students completed multiple experiments to find the chances of an event happening. Some of the experiments & simulations included the following: flipping a coin, spinning a spinner, drawing a card out of a deck, and rolling a dice. We are currently reviewing the next two weeks before the state test. After the state test, we will be doing Project Based Learning to finish up the statistics unit.

6th and 8th grade PE will be doing a combined strike/field unit over the next two weeks. Some of the games we will be playing are cricket, wiffleball and kickball. Information about field day will be coming out soon!

In **7th grade ELA** we just completed Module 2, where students explored how individuals react when faced with war. The World War II experiences of Japanese Americans and Native Americans show how the war affected Americans in different ways. We read the memoir *Farewell to Manzanar*, by Jeanne Wakatsuki Houston and James D. Houston and the novel *Code Talker*, by Joseph Bruchac. We are wrapping up the year with students creating informative and engaging non-fiction picture books for an audience of 1st and 2nd graders. We also plan to take a dive into George Orwell's novel, *Animal Farm* and explore the power of language to inspire, persuade, and control. Throughout, students will ask: What is the power of language?

Art News

All students created a paper mache` mask for a collaborative PBL with Mrs. Lamb called, The *Masks We Wear. Students had to show how they think others view them and how they perceive themselves.*











8th Grade Google Vector Drawing Self Portraits

The **7th Grade Social Studies** students are learning about the three branches of government! They created Superheroes that represented a specific branch of government and the "SUPER POWERS" or checks and balances powers that each branch has. The students were very creative and came up with some great ideas!



The **8th grade American History** students this semester have been focusing on strengthening their understanding of the US government, civic action groups, and how citizens

can be involved in their government and changes in their country. Students got to participate in a peaceful march where they displayed several types of actions including sashes from the Women's Suffrage movement, picket signs from the child labor movement, and inspirational messages from the movement to abolish slavery.

They also got to roleplay and become detectives trying to figure out if they could identify who would be a secret abolitionist helping enslaved people escape along the Underground Railroad in Ohio. We had quite the set of investigators this semester, and our actors were exceptional.

8th graders have also been digging up the past and investigating the original English settlements in America including the lost colony of Roanoke, the 1st permanent settlement of Jamestown, and the Pilgrims at Plymouth. They dove into new primary source artifacts and evidence found recently from the historic sites and predicted their own outcomes based on the facts they've found. They have made some awesome connections and discoveries along the way. It's been an awesome semester so far, and I can't wait to see what they accomplish next.




7th Grade Science students and several Junior High teachers took part in March Mammal Madness 2023 put on by Arizona State University. Students created their brackets and selected
