



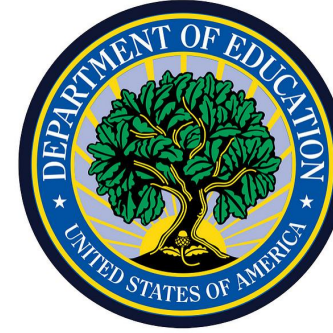

Purpose

- ▶ All Title I schools are required to hold an Annual Title I Parent meeting to explain and discuss the Title I Schoolwide program and requirements.
- ▶ Treutlen Elementary & Treutlen Middle/High are *Schoolwide* Title I schools.



What is Title I?

Title I is the largest federally funded program for elementary, middle & high schools.

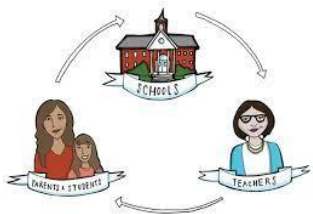


Through Title I, money is given to school districts around the country based on the number of low-income families in each district.



What is Title I?

Each district has discretion regarding the use of their Title I funds.



Title I exists to help students, teachers, and parents.



What is Title I ?

- Through Title I programs children do better in school and feel better about themselves
- The focus of the Title I program is on helping ALL students meet the same high academic standards expected of all children





Program Funds

- Treutlen County School District 2022-2023 Title I allocation is approximately **\$800,000**
- Title I Parent & Family Engagement funds set aside this year: **\$37,000**

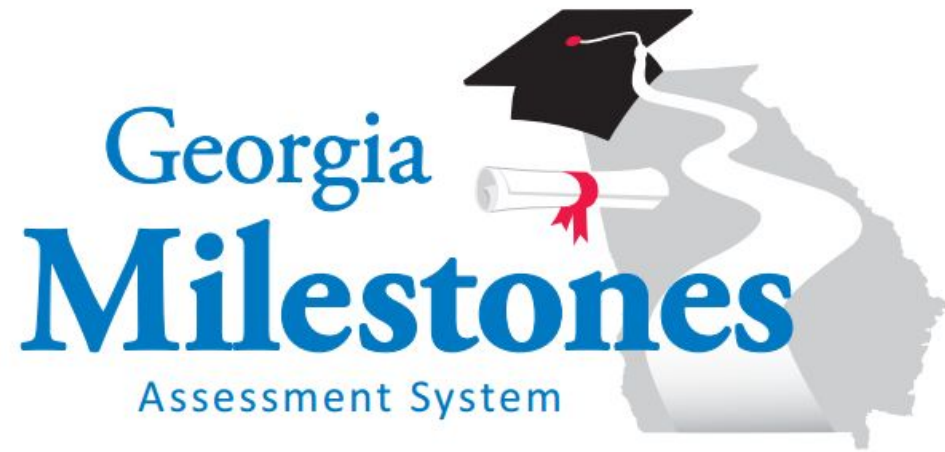

NWEA MAP

The NWEA MAP Test (Measures of Academic Progress) is an adaptive achievement and growth test. It creates a personalized assessment experience by adapting to each student's learning level—precisely measuring progress and growth for each individual student.



School Improvement Status

Based on data from 2019

- TMHS was identified as Targeted Support Improvement (TSI) status. Students with Disability (SWD) subgroup was performing in the lowest 5% in all CCRPI components. *Due to COVID, this status has not been updated.*
- TES was identified as a Promise School.

NOTE: We are currently awaiting the new CCRPI reports which will be available next month.

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) Title I Parent and Family Engagement Requirements

Parents Have the Right...

- ▶ To request and receive timely information regarding the professional qualifications of their child's teachers and paraprofessionals.
- ▶ To know if their child is assigned to, or taught, for four(4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who does not meet the district's professional qualifications requirements for the grade level or subject area taught.
- ▶ To know the level of achievement of their child in each area of the state assessment



Parents Have the Right...

- ▶ To be involved in the planning and implementation of the family & parent engagement program in their school
- ▶ To provide input regarding the 1% set-aside for Family & Parent Engagement

Goal #2 Increase the percentage of students from 54% to 60% scoring at or above the 50th percentile on NWEA MAP in Math .

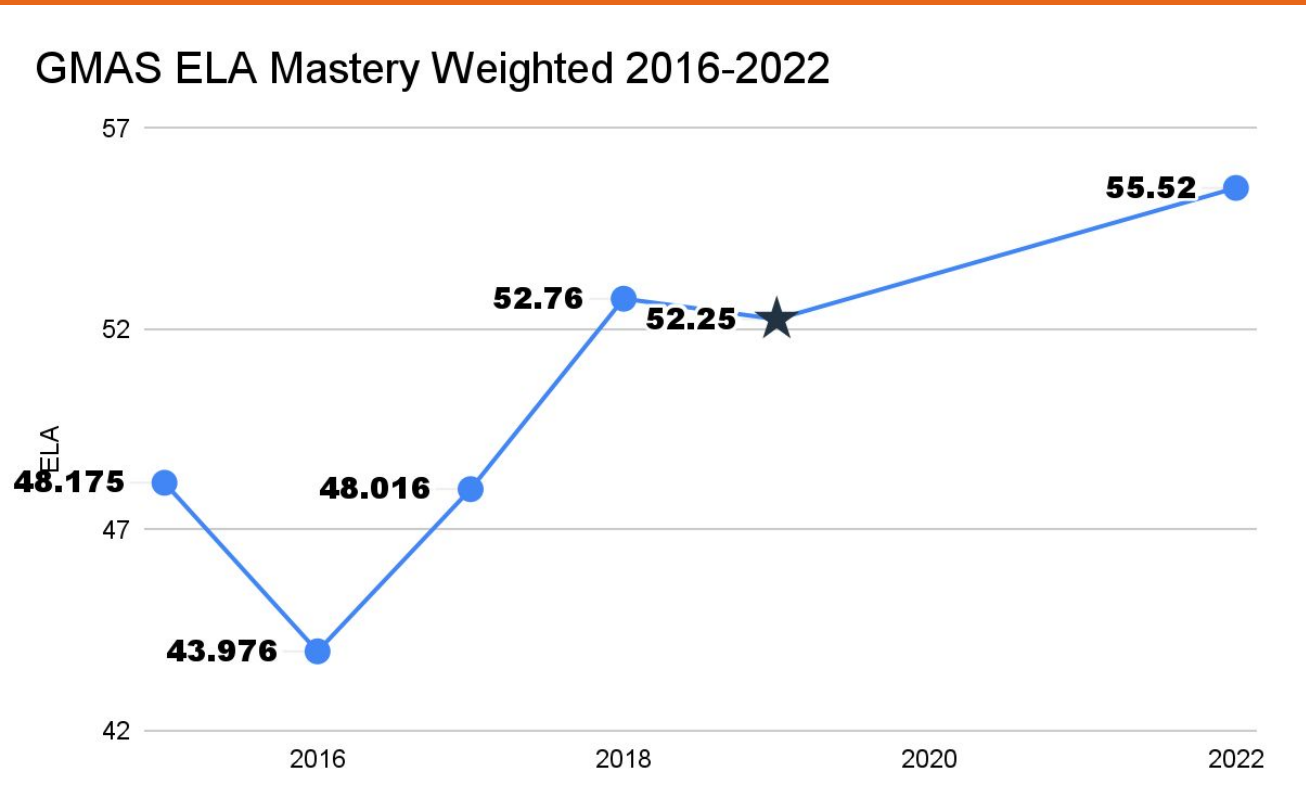
Goal #3 Implement structures to improve school culture and experiences for students and teachers.

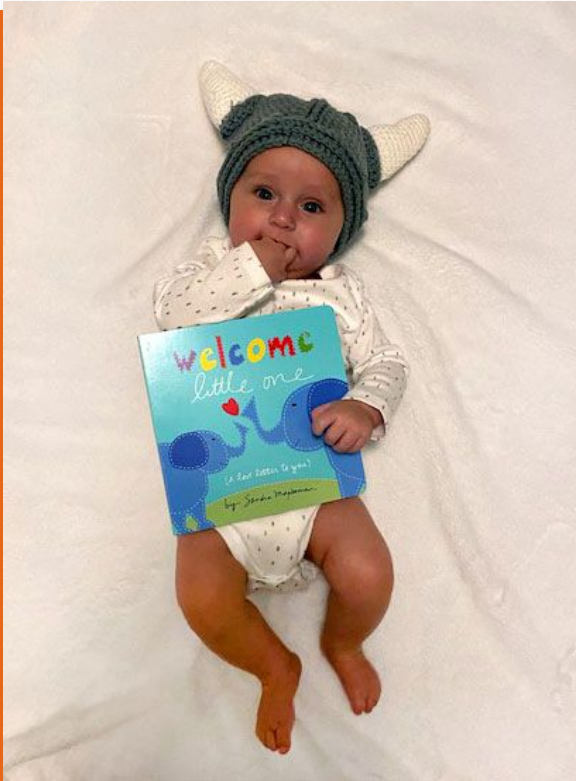

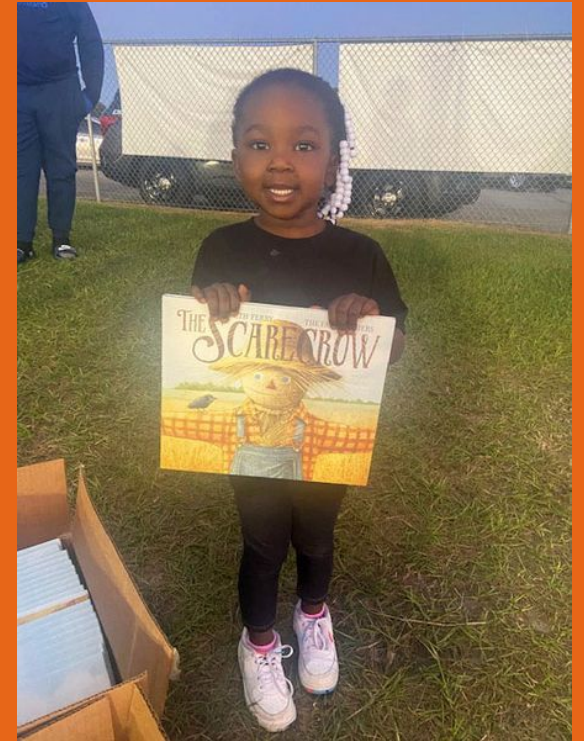


Birth to 4 Literacy

Books are also given out at football games and other community events to promote literacy.

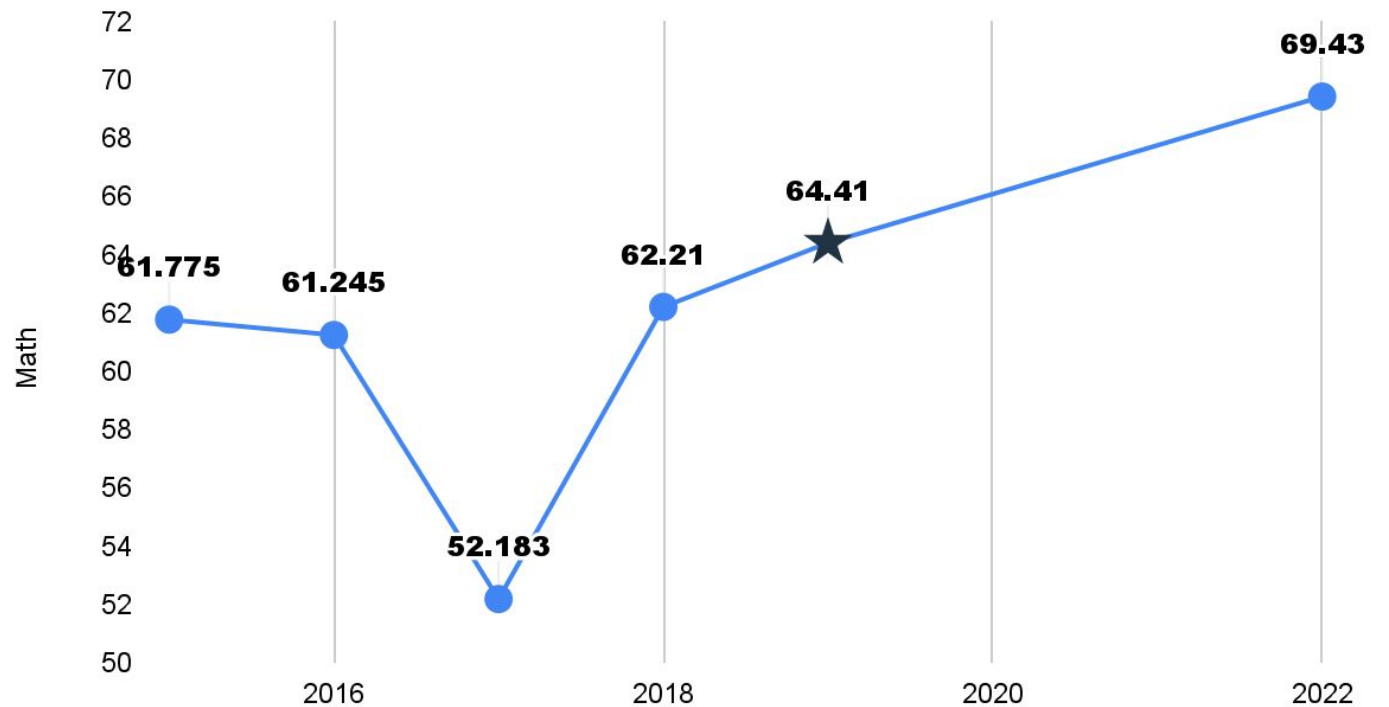


We have begun working with Head Start to share strategies and resources.

Social Emotional Learning

Mindset Monday-

Every Monday morning teachers and students engage in social emotional learning lessons to discuss issues such as self-confidence, conflict resolution and reinforce our Viking Values.

TMHS School Improvement Goals

- To increase the number of students scoring at or above the 50th percentile in Reading and Math by 5% from the previous year on NWEA-MAP.
- To increase the 2022-2023 4-year cohort graduation rate percentage by 3% in 2023.

TMHS Graduation Rate Released by GADOE

- The GADOE recently calculated and released the official graduation rate for 2021-2022 for Treutlen County: 89.1%.
- We met our previous goal in this area. The previous graduation rate was 83.5%.
- This rate includes all students entering the 4-year cohort in 9th grade.
