





Middle Grades Career Grant

The Career Awareness Exploration Initiative is designed to help students explore interests, strengths and talents they possess and to help them understand how these relate to future career opportunities.

The grant is funding a part-time Career Counselor (three days per week.)

How you can answer "What should I do with my life?" The students will determine what to do with their lives by looking closely at things that: Are important to them, they care about, they enjoy and are good at. In this course, students will ask questions that will help them discover what they love and have the skills for. Doing so can provide the students with career ideas, narrow down their options and give them more certainty about their decision. Once they answer "what do I want to do with my life," the students can begin pursuing their dream careers.

21st Century Skills and Careers

Provides a basic foundation for collaboration, workforce readiness and career exploration skills. The goal of this program is the exposure to career exploration content and resources that will enable learners to transition from school to higher education and/or the workforce effectively. This introduces students to a variety of career opportunities and the skills/education needed for success. Students will complete the Achieve 3000 Career Interest Survey. In the Sayreville district, the 21st Century Skill lessons are designed to develop basic communication, technological and collaborative skills. An additional focus of this program is the development of the academic, social, and interpersonal skills of each individual student.


INTRODUCTION TO TOMORROW'S TEACHERS

Dual Enrollment Opportunities


The Dual Enrollment program provides high school students the opportunity to earn both high school and college credit for courses that have been approved by Middlesex College.






Military branches: Facilitate individual meetings, provide academic documents to recruiters, host military informational sessions, administer the ASVAB.


