# Middle Grades Career Grant

## **Careerosity**

How you can answer "What should I do with my life?" The students will determine what to do with their lives by looking closely at things that: Are important to them, they care about, they enjoy and are good at. In this course, students will ask questions that will help them discover what they love and have the skills for. Doing so can provide the students with career ideas, narrow down their options and give them more certainty about their decision. Once they answer "what do I want to do with my life," the students can begin pursuing their dream careers.

## **21<sup>st</sup> Century Skills and Careers**

Provides a basic foundation for collaboration, workforce readiness and career exploration skills. The goal of this program is the exposure to career exploration content and resources that will enable learners to transition from school to higher education and/or the workforce effectively. This introduces students to a variety of career opportunities and the skills/education needed for success. Students will complete the Achieve 3000 Career Interest Survey. In the Sayreville district, the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Skill lessons are designed to develop basic communication, technological and collaborative skills. An additional focus of this program is the development of the academic, social, and interpersonal skills of each individual student.

## **COOPERATIVE WORK EXPERIENCE SEMINAR**

This is a cooperative program between school and the business community. After completing the course, students are ready to obtain starting positions in businesses. Students are expected to demonstrate competence through successful participation in the program and are encouraged to participate in DECA or FBLA, the student organizations. Besides classroom lessons, a minimum of 270 hours of outside school supervised work is required.

## **INTRODUCTION TO TOMORROW'S TEACHERS**

This course will provide students who may be interested in pursuing a career in education with a chance to learn more about the profession. This course will expose students to teaching and learning of various public education settings including early childhood, elementary, middle, and high school as well as the education services. This course is a prerequisite for Tomorrow's Teachers Honors.

An Honors course that studies the history, development, organization and practice of preschool, elementary and secondary education. Students will learn about the realities of public education and alternatives to public education.

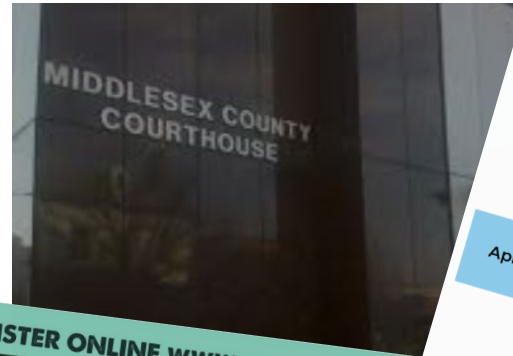

## Grade 7 Virtual Career Fair

OPTIONAL

This form is for individuals who would be interested in submitting a video for a virtual career fair. Individuals submitting this form must be over 18 years old.

Raising college and career awareness is a critical component of education. Exposing students to different careers and encouraging them to explore their own interests, skills, passions, and curiosities at this early age will allow them to begin to formulate their own plans for the future. We would love for you to participate and share your knowledge and experiences in the workforce!

Each participant is being asked to submit a **5 to 8 minute video** of themselves talking about their work, the path they took to get to where they are today, and what a day in the life of the career looks like. Some topics to discuss should include:

- An explanation of the job/career
- The requirements (academic or otherwise) to get into the profession
- What you actually do on a daily basis (tools you use, people you work with, where you work, uniform you wear, daily activities... etc.)
- Was it what you thought you would be doing when you grew up and how did you end up in the profession?
- What you like about the job/career
- Demonstrate the job (Hairdresser cutting or styling hair, mechanic working on a car, etc...)

Keeping in mind that our students are in grade 7, speakers are encouraged to use props, pictures, visual/audio aids, work related items, etc and age-appropriate language/vocabulary.

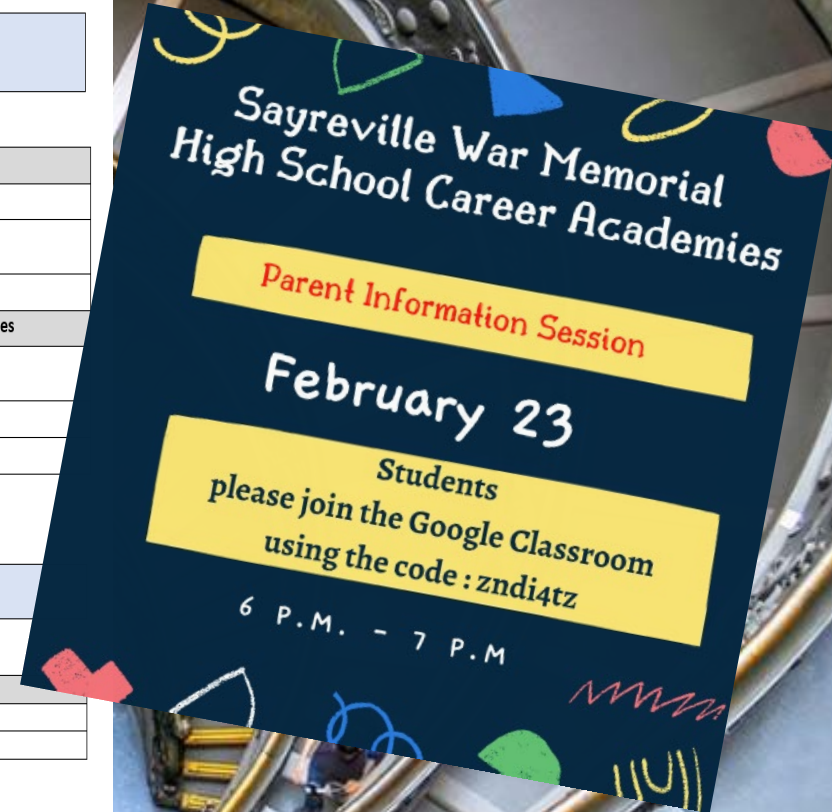

## Dual Enrollment Opportunities


The Dual Enrollment program provides high school students the opportunity to earn both high school and college credit for courses that have been approved by Middlesex College.

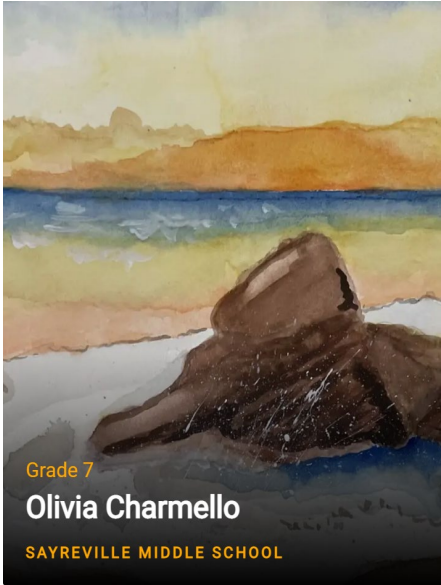
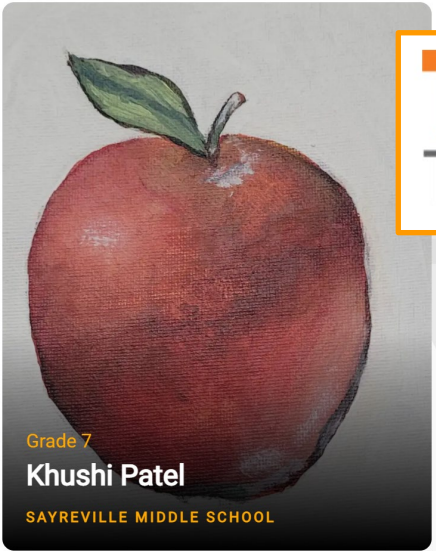
