


Budget Overview

- FLAT Evidence Based Funding (EBF) ANTICIPATED \$2 Million INCREASE
- \$2 Million REDUCTION in CPPRT.
- \$2 Million Additional CARES Grant (Used for Student / Staff devices for remote learning and Covid Supplies)
- Added Alternative Education for Grades 9-12 and Temporary Alternative Classroom (TAC) as part of 5 Year Plan
- Competitive wage adjustments for minimum wage increase / minimum teacher salary increase
- Roof Prather Anticipated use of Fund Balance from Fund 20 (\$1,800,000)
- Track Resurface Anticipated use of Fund Balance from Fund 20 (\$100,000)
- Solar Project Anticipated use of Fund Balance from Fund 20 (\$350,000)
- Portion of Roof at Coolidge
- Coolidge Dishwasher & Maryville Mixer
- 5 Additional Elementary Teachers, 3 Alt Ed Teachers, 1 TAC Teacher, 1 ESL Teacher
- Additional 3 ParaProfessionals, 4 Monitors, 1 SRO, 2 Cafe, and 3 Custodials for Alt Ed Center
- Added Director of Communications, Asst. Prather Principal, Alt Ed. Principal, and reduced Director of Student Services
- 7% increase in Health Insurance


Revenue By Fund




Expenditure By Fund




Budget Revenue to Expenditure History (Operating Funds)




Fund 10 Revenue




Fund 20 Revenue

Fund 10 Expenditures




2019-2020 Actual


Fund 20 Expenditures




Fund 40 Expenditures

The Covid Effect

- 2020-2021 without any additional EBF, increased expenditures, and \$2 Million additional CPPRT GCSD9 would have had \$500,000 Dollar Budgeted Surplus
- 2020-2021 with estimated additional \$2 Million EBF money would have had a \$2.5 Million Dollar Budget Surplus.
- 2020-2021 with \$2 Million reduction of CPPRT and \$2 Million EBF reduction resulted in a \$1.5 Million dollar Budget Deficit

Current Budget Deficit	CPPRT Reduction	EBF Funding	Anticipated Budget Surplus
-\$1.5 Million	+ \$2 Million	+ \$2 Million	\$2.5 Million

Subject To Change!

- It is going to be a rollercoaster ride!
- Covid19 could have a dramatic impact on expenditures either up or down
- Federal Stimulus for State Budget
- State Graduated Income Tax Amendment
- Potential State Budget Cuts 5% 2020 / 10% 2021
- EBF formula could help regain losses of CPPRT
- CPPRT could continue to decline
- Could see delayed payments for 2020-2021
- Could possibly see an EBF Reduction in 2021-2022
