## School Description

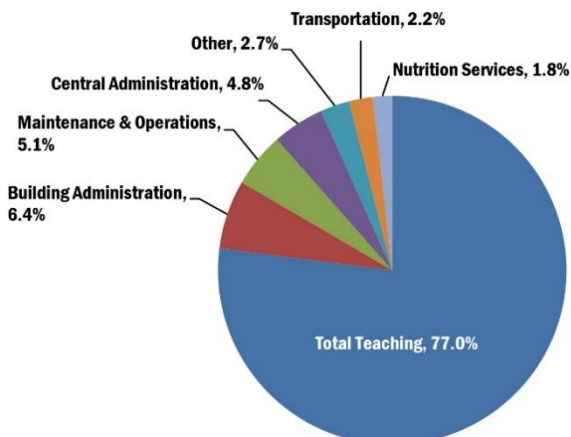
Ella Baker Elementary sits nestled in the woods of the Redmond Ridge East neighborhood in Redmond, Washington. Ella Baker serves approximately 500 students kindergarten through 5<sup>th</sup> grade. Students then move on to Timberline Middle School.

Ella Baker was founded in 2018 with a staff who developed a clear mission that focuses on empowering changemakers. All staff are responsible for developing students both academically and socially. We believe in developing the 6 C's; content, collaboration, communication, character, citizenship and critical thinking. This is done through intentional SEL planning around the Baker 8 Character traits and the integrated service learning projects that all students engage in. Ella Baker is the first state in Washington to be recognized as a National School of Character due to the commitment of staff, students and the community.

Ella Baker proudly serves a diverse community of learners. The staff is committed to creating a sense of belonging for each child through equity-based practices. We have an incredibly supportive community and PTSA who contribute the success of our school.

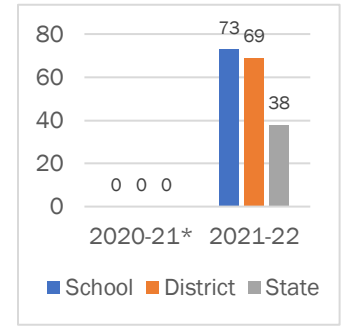
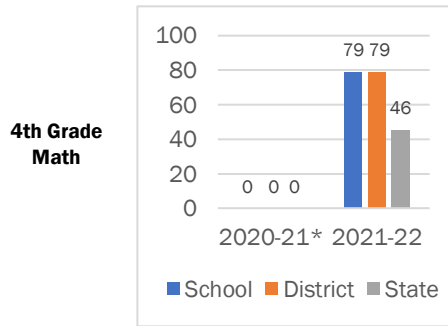
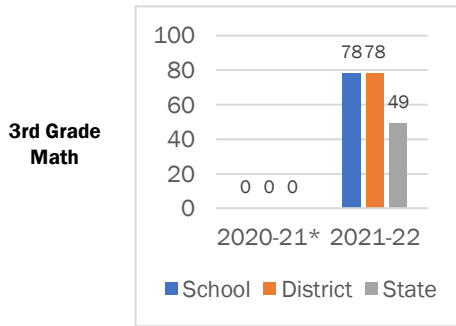
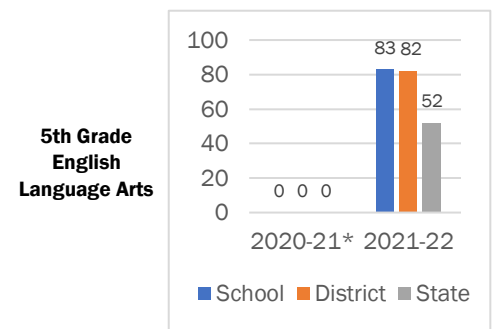
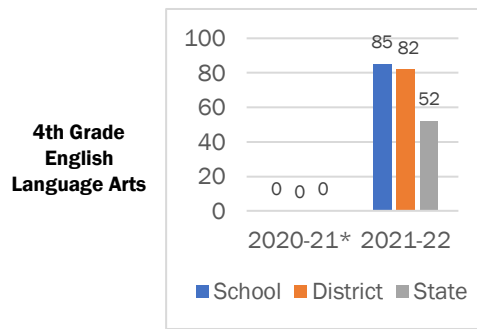
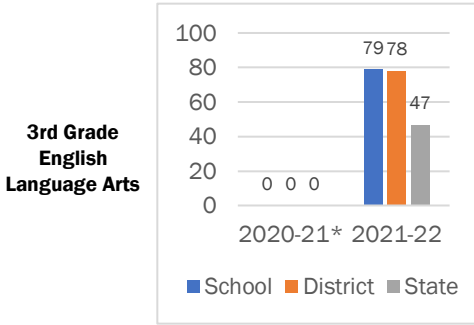
## 2021-22 School Goals

Through our school improvement process (SIP), our staff analyzes data and creates priority goals to ensure we are meeting the needs of all students. While we focus on the overall academic success, our priority goals help us intentionally focus on closing the achievement gap. Priority goals for 2021-2022

- Literacy: 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade. 75% of grade 3-5 students who are identified as low-income will score at or above standard as measured by the SBA.
- Literacy: K-2<sup>nd</sup> grade. 75% of students who are identified as low-income will score at or above standard as measured by FastBridge.
- Sense of Belonging: 90% of students K-5 will indicate they have both a sense of belonging and can be themselves at Ella Baker as measured by SEL student survey and Panorama survey.

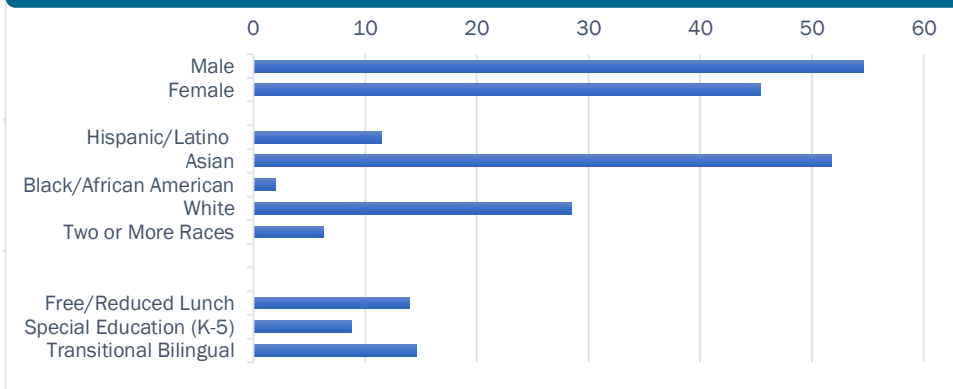
