I am excited by the opportunity to join the Sanders Unified School District. I have had an extensive career dedicated to educating the children of rural Arizona. My career began with 13 successful years in the classroom teaching Math and French. Since then I have served as a preschool principal, elementary school principal, high school assistant principal, high school principal, district career ladder director and superintendent.

In 2001 I was selected as one of 24 teachers on a task force assigned to visit Cuba and assess the condition of schools and families on the island. This special task force of 24 teachers from across the nation helped to establish goodwill between the two countries and provide important information to Congress on how the families and schools in Cuba were progressing. This experience gave me the opportunity to work with Congress to prepare sensitive reports on international affairs.

As a turnaround superintendent I was responsible for the daily operations of the district including everything from curriculum design and best instructional practices to teacher mentoring and facilities management. I took a personal interest in making sure that our teachers and facilities were prepared to help the students succeed and that our district policies and budgets were aligned with our educational goals. I found great personal excitement in helping my team define and focus on the mission, values, and goals of the district. Establishing a strategic plan with short term wins kept everyone focused on student achievement and the importance of preparing our students to become successful citizens.

My responsibilities as the District Career Ladder Director included mentoring new teachers, student progress plans, professional growth, higher level teaching responsibilities, teacher evaluations, and professional development workshops. In this district leadership role I was able to visit and observe classroom teaching in all the schools of our district. I served as the main resource for questions about the latest and best teaching practices. I also advised district leaders and principals on teacher improvement plans and helped move our teaching staff toward differentiated instruction. As the director of this program I was also responsible for a sophisticated performance pay program for teachers which allowed them to earn additional money by demonstrating their teaching proficiency.

While serving as an administrator I became involved with the Arizona State Career Ladder Network and eventually became the senior co-chair for the entire State of Arizona. I met monthly with representatives from all of the 25 school districts within the career ladder program which represented nearly 2/3 of the students in the state. This position gave me the opportunity to lead discussions on teacher improvement at the state level. This dialogue included organizing events with representatives from the state legislature, business leaders, and educational consultants.

I also have extensive administrative skills from my time as a business office manager. My management duties included accounts payable, accounts receivable, payroll, quarterly reports, correspondence, and computer operations. Drawing on these skills has allowed me to streamline educational organizations, maximize our limited resources and improve community/parent connections.
