### The Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Service

Martin Luther King Day for the year 2023 is celebrated/ observed on Monday, January 16th, which is close to King's actual birthday on January 15. An advocate of nonviolent activism, Dr. King became the youngest man to ever receive the Nobel Peace Prize. His life came to an abrupt and untimely end when he was assassinated in 1968 in Tennessee. MLK Day is the only federal holiday designated as a National Day of Service to encourage all Americans to volunteer to improve their communities. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. believed in a nation of freedom and justice for all, and encouraged all citizens to live up to the purpose and potential of

America by applying the principles of nonviolence. MLK Day of Service is a way to honor his life and teachings by engaging in community action that continues to solve social problems.
