

## Seizures on the Bus

**If you see a seizure start on the bus:**

- 1. Stop the bus** until seizure ends or help arrives. Check clock for when seizure began.
2. Call Dispatch: call parent or school nurse to assist you.
  - a. Check care plan instructions for specific student.**
3. Prevent injury
  - a.** Ease student across double seat or keep in wheelchair reclining it if possible.
  - b.** Keep student away from hard, sharp or hot objects.  
Do not restrain.  
Do not put **anything** in mouth.  
Loosen restrictive clothing if needed  
Loosen lap belt if needed
  - c.** If possible, position yourself so you can place student's head in your lap or Turn student on side.
4. Monitor for changes in breathing; *Color changes of lips, face, skin; saliva able to run from mouth.*
5. Check clock again for when seizure ends.
6. If seizure is longer than **5 minutes** (**check individual student's instructions**) or student has difficulty breathing, **call 911!**
7. **Prepare to do CPR if necessary!**
8. If not already done, notify parents and school nurse
9. Document **seizure on a seizure report.** Give copies to teacher, parent and school nurse.
