TREASURER'S' OFFICE BEFORE PURCHASING YOUR PROM TICKET. All outside Guests must submit a photo ID along with the



This Immunization is required by the state of Indiana to enter 12th grade. MCSC can exclude students whose immunizations are not up to date.

Be sure to plan ahead and get this vaccination completed at your next doctor visit. You can also visit your local clinic, pharmacy, or health department for vaccinations.
