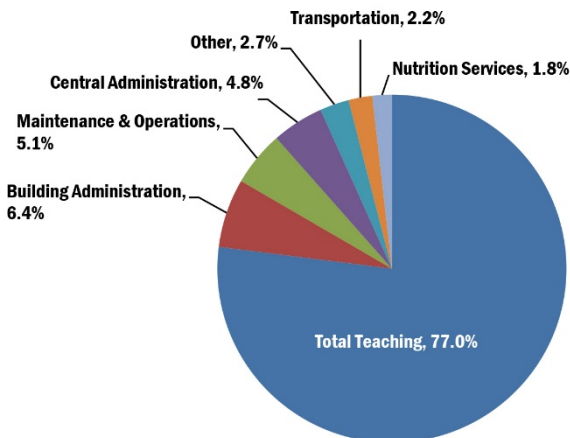
School Description

The Environmental & Adventure School (EAS) was founded in 1999. EAS students achieve academic, personal and social goals in a challenging educational program. Much of the curriculum is integrated around an environmental focus. This focus encourages purposeful learning. It provides connections to the community and opportunities to develop as leaders, stewards and responsible citizens.

EAS students apply skills and concepts from all subjects to investigating local watershed and global issues. They conduct extensive research and experience hands-on learning through community stewardship projects. EAS students develop confidence and skills to work effectively as leaders, mentors and team members through a wide variety of outdoor activities and projects.

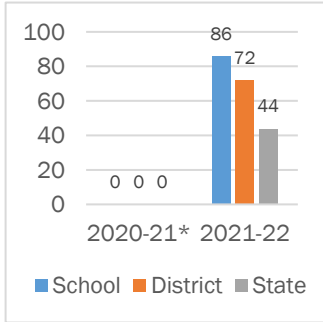
2021-22 School Goals

- Grades 6-8 English Language Arts (ELA): Increase percentage of students at standard from 86.9 % to 90%
- Grades 6-8 Math: Increase percentage of students at standard from 79.7% to 86%
- Grade 8 science: Increase the number of EAS students meeting standard on the WACS-8 assessment from 86.3% to 95%.
- Achievement gap: Increase the number of EAS Special Education students meeting standard on the SBAC-ELA and Math assessment to 70%.
- College & Career Readiness: All students will complete the two 8th grade Career Cruising activities and produce a reflective work product for inclusion in their end-of-year display/portfolio of learning.
- School Effectiveness: Increase staff agreement with the survey results showing they "Agree Mostly" or "Agree Completely" on 90% assessment questions.
- Attendance: Continue to maintain a truancy incidence rate of 0.1%
- Discipline: Reduce the school-wide incidences of harassment/bullying requiring corrective discipline to <6.

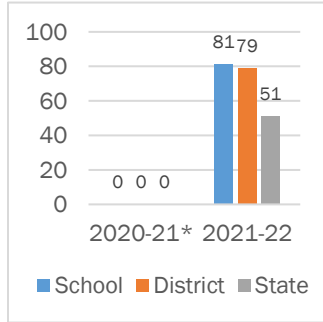

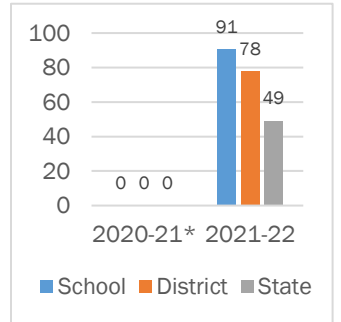
6th Grade English Language Arts



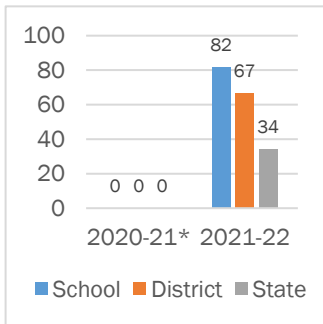
7th Grade English Language Arts



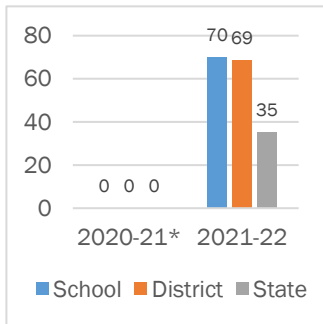
8th Grade English Language Arts



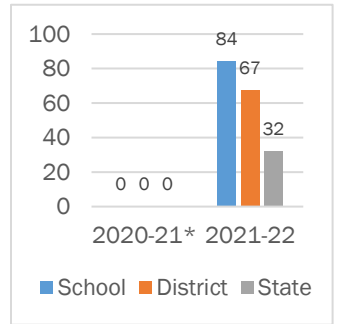
6th Grade Math



7th Grade Math

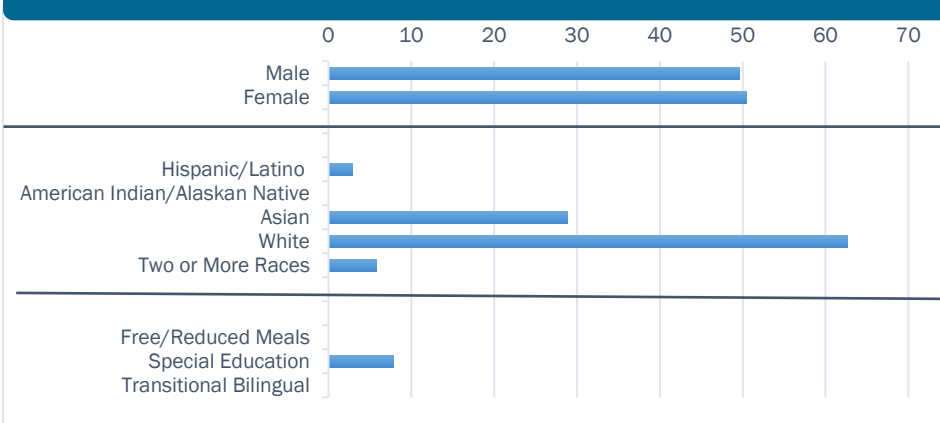


8th Grade Math
