If we do something that is hurtful, it is up to us to fix the problem and make things right between the other person and ourselves.

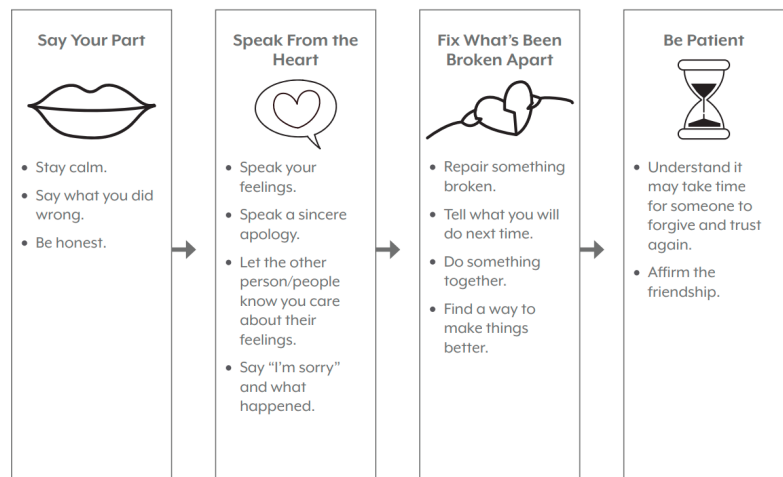
Students practiced using phrases in response to
