Maddie says TSS gave her the tools, support, and confidence to help her become the person she is today: self-assured, accomplished, determined, and happy.

First Day Ready

"I stepped out of the car at age eight on my first day at TSS. I didn't know which way to go or turn. Ms. Forry welcomed me, helped me with my name tag, found my locker, and guided me to my homeroom. For the first time ever, she made me feel seen. She heard me, too, when I asked her, in a soft apologetic whisper, 'call me by my nickname Maddie, not Madeleine.' I remember those moments of validation."



A Transformative Shift

"I still use two column note-taking, flash cards, and Quizlet just as TSS taught me. If I didn't go to TSS, I'm not sure where I would be academically or socially. I know I'm more confident today. I carry a 3.4 GPA in college now, I've been a three-year starter on Castleton's lacrosse team, I live off campus in my own apartment, I'm considering grad school, and I've developed meaningful relationships as well. I take great pride in it all."

Social Emotional Awareness

"Every school needs to be aware of their students' mental health. I'm dyslexic and have anxiety, I've had them all my life. I've been dealt some really big emotional challenges that include bullying and loss of friends, but with the support of family, friends, coaches, and unexpected acquaintances, I've navigated my own life journey. I have found leadership through self-direction."



A TSS Reflection

"I remember the literal spotlight on me for what felt like an hour during TSS's Year End Recognition night. Uncomfortable for me, yes, but my parents loved it! Those ten minutes validated their decision to move me to TSS. For me it was the community—soccer with Coach Demunnik, recess wall ball, the San Francisco trip with Dr. Buckingham, hanging out with Ms. Warner after school, playing computer games with Ms. Plante, having friends with not just one group but many. I thank you all for giving me a chance."
