<b>New Disinfectant Machine – Blake Glenn</b>		
Electrostatic sprayer is the new disinfectant machine used in the district		
Drastically reduces staph infections; 65% less chemicals; 70% faster application		
Oxvir is the chemical used – kills things in 5 minutes and completely dries in 10 minutes		
CISD was the second district to test when it was first ruled out		
CISD has acquired thirteen (13) machines

CISD nurses work hard to ensure all students have their immunizations up to date		
99-100% compliant as compared to other districts in the state of Texas		
<b>Flu Season Preview – Christi Gregory *</b>		
Watched Handwashing videos for both Elementary and Secondary		
If three (3) or more students are absent in an Elementary classroom, investigate to see if the absences are for the same reason		
In Secondary, if there is a drop of 10% per grade level an investigation occurs		
Fever is 100° or above, student must go home and not return until fever free for 24 hours <i>without</i> medication as mandated by CDC, Centers for Disease Control, which is CISD's board policy
