INITIAL ELIGIBILITY TO ENROLL

- Be a 6th through 12th grader
- Completed ONE high school course
- 2.0 GPA for Career/Tech like
 HVAC, Auto, Welding or Culinary
- 2.5 GPA to take SLS1122
- 3.0 GPA for College Credit like ENC1101

- Student will meet with their School
 Counselor to verify eligibility
- School Counselor will direct student to apply to DSC

- PLEASE have students use their social security number when registering. It makes logging in and matching them easier for the college.
- Students should use an email that they check regularly to enroll.


STEP TWO: TESTING REQUIREMENTS

- Taking the PERT Test
 - The P.E.R.T. assesses readiness for college-level coursework in English language arts and mathematics. There are three subject area tests – reading, writing, and mathematics. A student's scores indicate appropriate course placement upon entering college and in preparation for college and career as high school students.
 - The scaled scores range from 50-150.

- The test is on the computer.
- There are a total of 30 questions per placement subtest.
- The P.E.R.T. is untimed. The average time to complete the mathematics and writing subtests is approximately 30 minutes. The reading test average is 60 minutes.

MATH CLASS TEST SCORE OPTIONS

- Unweighted high school GPA of 3.0 and a grade of "B" or better in Algebra 1, Geometry or Algebra 2, PreCalculus, Math for College Algebra.
- Eligible for MAT1033/2106/MGF2107 only.
- Students must also meet the minimum SLS1122 reading/writing placement to begin the Dual Enrollment program. DSC accepts courses and grades on the public high school transcript as an official record.

STEP THREE: ADVISING AND CLASS REGISTRATION

- Complete Virtual New Student Advising
 - Schedule your virtual group new student advising session for an overview of the programs offered, how to select courses, important dates, dual enrollment guidelines, and your Dual Enrollment Form

- Complete your Dual Enrollment Form, then connect with your school counselor to review your course selections.
 Submit completed forms to <u>DualEnrollment@DaytonaState.edu</u>.
- Things to Consider
 - Dual enrolled students are limited to **2** fully online courses per 15-week semester, with the exception of students who have earned at least 30 credits and have a minimum 3.5 DSC GPA.
 - All courses taken at DSC will become a part of the student's permanent college and high school transcript.
 - Course materials and class discussions may involve mature topics not typically included in secondary courses. Courses are not modified to accommodate variations in student age and maturity.

COURSE REGISTRATION

- A Dual Enrollment Hold is placed on each student's account and will remain on the account until high school graduation.
- Dual Enrolled students do not have access to register for courses on their own.
- All course selections must be submitted on a completed Dual Enrollment form to DualEnrollment@DaytonaState.edu by the student.
- Grades earned by Dual Enrolled students become a permanent part of both the high school and college transcript and are weighted on the high school transcript the same as AP/IB/AICE courses

SLS1122: MANAGING YOUR SUCCESS

- SLS1122 Managing Your Success acquaints students with college culture and academic expectations. In addition to learning techniques that can be applied to all facets of life, other important components engage students with academic resources (Library, Academic Support Center, Writing Center), familiarize students with technology common to course usage, and help them become knowledgeable about non-academic resources available at DSC.
- This course is required for all students enrolled in the Associate of Arts (AA) program.

MAINTAINING DE PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

Students must maintain a minimum 3.0 cumulative, unweighted high school GPA (2.0 for Career/Vocational) to continue to participate.

Dual Enrolled students must maintain a minimum 2.0 cumulative Daytona State College GPA to continue participating in Dual Enrollment.

A grade of "D", "F", "FN", or "W1" but still have the GPA? Required to repeat the course and they may only enroll in that course alone during the following semester.

A grade of "F", "FN, "W" or "W1" in more than one semester will mean an end of Dual Enrollment eligibility.

• WHAT STUDENTS CAN DO TO INCREASE CHANCES OF SUCCESS

- Self advocate, be organized and have a strong handle on time management.
- Check DSC email DAILY.
- Communicate with professors.
- Take advantage of offices hours and tutoring when struggling.
- Ask for help EARLY!

WHAT PARENTS CAN DO TO HELP

Support	Support your student by checking in with their progress in class.
Encourage	Encourage them to reach out to professors for assistance when they are struggling.
Help	Help them find balance in high school and college with coursework and activities.
Remember	Remember that as a dual enrollment student, your high school student is treated like a college student.
