

AB19

TWO YEARS NO COST

Free Tuition for the First Two Academic Years for students who meet the following eligibility requirements:

- Student must be in their first two years of college
- Student must be enrolled in 12 or more units per semester (Fall/Spring)
- Student must complete a FAFSA or CA Dream Act application for each academic year
- Student must <u>NOT</u> be receiving any other wavier of fees, such as the California College Promise Grant
- Must be a CA resident or AB540

If a student meets the above criteria, their tuition fees will be paid for in their first two academic years.

An Academic Year is defined as the Summer, Fall, and Spring terms.

AB19 is processed in late October for eligible students.

Benefits to Thinking 30 @ Delta College

CALIFORNIA DREAM ACT Apply by March 2

The California Dream Act Application allows students interested in attending eligible California Colleges, Universities and Career Education Programs to apply for state financial aid. This application is unrelated to the federal Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program.

CA Dream Act Eligibility

The California Dream Act Application is for students who meet the qualifications of AB 540

Attended a CA high school for 3+ years

Graduated from a CA high school or the equivalent

Enrolled in an accredited CA college or university

Three or more years of full-time high school coursework AND a combination of elementary, middle and/or high school in CA for a combined total of three or more years

In case of a student without lawful immigration status, filed an affidavit with the institution stating that they have filed an application to legalize status or will file as soon as they are eligible



Delta College Scholarships

Each year Delta College awards students with scholarships to use towards their education. Scholarships are awarded for many reasons including major, financial need, program completion and academic performance. The Scholarship Application opens every year in January, so check back frequently for updates!

How to Apply

- 1. Register for an account through our Scholarship portal @
- 2. After you register for an account, you will be able to sign in and work on your scholarship application until the deadline. As you work on the application, your progress will be automatically saved each time you logout.
- 3. Scholarships will require additional documents, which are submitted online. Scholarship applications are not considered complete unless the application is electronically submitted by the student and all documents are received by March 2nd.
- 4. All scholarship applications will require (at a minimum):
 - A completed online scholarship application
 - Two letters of recommendation
 - A brief essay
- 5. Always read the instructions for a scholarship before applying.

- 2. "Application Confirmation" email

- Transfer funds to current checking account
- Open up account with Bank Mobile

- 3. Upload documents through your MyDelta
- Specialist needs more documents OR awards student
- 5. Student receives an email with award and disbursement information




Enter Your Password

- If this is your first time logging in, your password is SJdc! plus your 6 digit birthdate
- Example: If your birthdate is 06/04/1995 your password is SJdc!060495
- Passwords are case sensitive
- Once you log in the first time, you will be prompted to change your password



Uploading Documents

You will need to upload your documents through your MyDelta. The link for accessing the upload portal will show up on your **To Do List** through your MyDelta portal **OR** go to <u>deltacollege.verifymyfafsa.com</u>.

Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)


Student must maintain SAP in order to continue eligibility for financial aid.

- Must maintain a 2.0 Cumulative GPA
- Must complete 67% of enrolled units (cumulative and for the semester)
 - A student taking two 3 unit classes must pass all of their classes
 - 3 (number of units completed) / 6 (number of units taken) = 50% of units completed does not meet SAP
 - F's, W's, I's, EW's FW's, and NP's are non-passing grades and negatively impact pace (Exception: EW's during COVID-19 pandemic)
- Must not exceed the Maximum Time Frame (Pace)
 - Students have up to 150% units to complete their program.

Example: 60 x 150% units = 90 units

Example: 20 x 150% units = 30 units

Student's are disqualified if they do not meet the above SAP standards for two consecutive semesters.



What Else Do I Need to Know?

- 6 year lifetime Pell eligibility limit
- Consortium Form
 - Receiving financial aid when attending more than one college at the same time.





Book Advance Voucher

- The Book Voucher allows you to purchase books from the Bookstore
- It is **not** free money
- It is an advance against your financial aid award
- The amount you spend at the Bookstore will be deducted from your disbursement
- If the amount is not deducted from your disbursement, you will owe.

Example

Category	Amount
Pell Award	\$1,600.00
Bookstore Cost	\$250.00
Disbursed to You	\$1,350.00



Book Voucher Eligibility

Must have **completed** the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or California Dream Act Application (CADAA) for the current aid year

Must have **submitted** ALL documents on your "to do" tab in the MyDelta Portal then you can apply for a Book Voucher.

Note: Once your book voucher has been processed you will receive an email to your Delta college email account with details on how to use your Book Voucher and instructions on how to order your books.




Some Reasons You Are Not Approved


