PROGRAM

CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT - INSTRUCTIONAL TECHNOLOGY

The Board of Trustees recognizes the responsibility for the quality of the educational program that includes instructional technology for the purpose of increasing student achievement. The Board directs that instructional technology be assessed, revised, and evaluated on a regular basis.

In order to implement the Administrative Regulation, the District must develop, implement, evaluate, and revise a Technology Plan that improves student access to technology for the purpose of using and becoming competent in the basic skills. The Technology Plan must also provide for increased staff access and training to utilize classroom workstations, multi-use labs, specialty labs, and distance-learning technologies that focus on student learning and student achievement in the content area. The Technology Plan must include a strategy to provide technical support programs for computer-based technology to ensure effective use of instructional technology and communication by students, parents, and staff. The Technology Plan must include measurable goals, strategies and timelines with responsibilities assigned by the administration.

Instructional technology must be supported by professional development through the District's Professional Development Center and other staff development programs. The Technology Plan must include strategies and timelines with responsibilities assigned by the administration for the professional development for the staff to ensure that students achieve basic advanced performance skills through the use of instructional technology.
