EXTRA! More Back to School News Final Forms Roll Out

Parents and students should have received on an email on August 17 with

detailed guidance for this process. Please contact your child's school if you did not receive an email.

All students will utilize "Remote Start" days with the help of Final Forms. Final Forms allows you to complete and sign enrollment, back-to-school, and athletic participation forms for your students. The most exciting news is that Final Forms saves data from season-to-season and year-to-year, meaning that you will never need to enter the same information twice! Final Forms also pre-populates information wherever possible, for each of your students, saving you time. In addition to

the completion of forms, the district, buildings, and departments will utilize this process to share out important information through video and written communication to:

(1) share and collect traditional educational information and processes,

(2) aid in the educational and operational transition to one campus, and

(3) provide additional training on the multiple health and safety protocols contributed to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Prior to the first day of school, students and/or parents will have required assigned "actions" through the Final Forms platform. With the completion of the assigned "actions" by our parents and students, we will count these efforts as Remote Learning which will then be counted as days attended for students. Access to the Final Forms platform will be given in August, well before the actual first day of school. Within the platform, the assigned "actions" will have an assignment due date.

August 2020

Remote Start days do not influence or change other student or staff work, professional, or school days. It is important to understand that Remote Learning has an attendance process.

Attendance for students will be linked to the completion of assigned "actions." The three days will count toward the overall hours of instruction that is mandated within Ohio Revised Code.

Parents of upcoming 12th grade students:

Documentation of a meningococcal (MCV4) vaccine given on or after the student's 16th birthday must be on file at Warren High School before your child can enter the 12th grade in August of 2020. This also includes students who attend the Washington County Career Center and those who take college courses. Please contact your healthcare provider, your local pharmacy, the Marietta-Belpre City Health Dept. (740-373-0611) or the Washington County Health Dept. (740-374-2782) to make arrangements for your child to receive the vaccine. Once your child has received the vaccine, please provide a copy of the documentation to Warren High School. Building Level Guidelines - High School

Transitions: Will occur as normal at the HS with extended time between each period. Masks are required. All students are to walk single file on the right side of the hall.

Restroom Use: Maximum Occupancy signs are posted on each restroom. Students are to wait 6 feet apart outside the restroom if it is at capacity. The extended transition time should help students avoid being tardy. With teacher permission, students may also sign out of class to use the restroom. Please scan the QR code or use the chrome box by the door to check in and out of classrooms.

Lunch:

- 1. Students will be notified of eating groups on the first day of school.
- 2. Students will be assigned seats for each lunch period. Students are permitted to choose where they sit originally and then the seats become assigned.
- 3. Students must remain in their seats during the entire lunch period.
- 4. Students will be released by the monitor, by table to get in line for lunch.
- 5. Markers will be on the floor for standing in line for lunch.
- 6. Cafeteria staff will enter student pins so students do not touch the keypad.
- 7. There will be an extra amount of trash cans throughout the cafeteria.
- 8. Students will be released for trash.

Before and After School

Before School:

- 1. Student drivers remain in their own car in the mornings until the 7:17 bell.
- 2. Bus riders should be social distanced in the building 6 lobby and the cafeteria after exiting the bus.

Athletics and Extra Curricular Activities:

- 1. Students are not permitted to loiter in the building after school.
- 2. Those waiting for practice or a bus should stay in the cafeteria in the marked seating.

Student Drop Off and Pick Up:

- 1. Parent pick up and drop off will operate the same as last year.
- 2. All parents and students should enter driveway 2.
- 3. Parents should also exit driveway 2.

Bus Expectations:

- 1. Follow all district level bus protocols.
- 2. Bus riders should be social distanced in the building 6 lobby and the cafeteria after exiting the bus.
- 3. Report directly to the bus after school.

Virtual Learning Guidelines - High School

WHAT IS VIRTUAL LERNING? Virtual learning is an educational experience or activity that is delivered through an online platform and can be accessed outside of the classroom.

GETTING STARTED

- 1. Students are required to be enrolled in a total of 5 courses including core and elective courses.
- 2. Communication with the teacher is key to the success of virtual learning.
- 3. Teachers will require the same assignments and expectations, when appropriate, of Virtual Learning students as they do for in class students.
- 4. Google Classroom is the chosen Learning Management System.
- 5. To access Google classroom, first log in to Google Chrome.
- 6. Under the nine dots beside your account logo, go to Classroom.
- 7. Teachers will send an invite through your school email with a code to join the class.

TRANSFERRING IN/OUT OF VIRTUAL LEARNING

- 1. Any student who enrolls in Virtual Learning will be placed in the program for the entire semester. Families will be permitted to transfer back into a physical classroom for the Spring 2021 semester, but will need to request that transfer via contact with the Director of Special Services, Larry Ryan at the Warren Administrative Office prior to December 18, 2020.
- 2. Students will not be permitted to go between the Virtual Learning option and in person instruction once school begins.

COMPUTERS, SUPPLIES

- 1. Chromebooks, computers, and any other electronic device will not be provided by the school district.
- 2. Printers are optional and are not provided by the district. Students can participate fully without one, but having a printer may be a convenience.
- 3. Common school supplies should be readily available for your child (i.e. paper, pencils, markers, highlighters, scissors, tape, calculator...). These supplies will be the family's responsibility.

ATTENDANCE

- 1. Attendance is a key component of Virtual Learning. Students will be required to respond every day to a Question of the Day or Exit Slip. Students who do not respond will be counted absent on that day.
- 2. Students will not be required to log in at the time assigned for the Virtual Learning period, but it is a recommended practice.
- 3. Students will be required to have a conference scheduled by the teacher at least one day a week. Aside from that scheduled meeting, the student's work schedule should be flexible. Students may work during the hours that best meet the family schedule.

GRADING

- 1. Grading practices and reporting timelines will remain as those set by the building/district.
- 2. Students will receive grades on the work submitted.
- 3. Students are expected to complete their own assignments and assessments. Failure to do so will result in no credit given until assignments or assessments have been redone.
- 4. The final grade for each course will be based upon the grading policy of Warren High School.

TROUBLESHOOTING

- 1. The teacher should always be the first contact if a student is having difficulties with the functioning of a course.

Starting School Under the Yellow and Orange Advisory Levels:

- 1. All criteria from the planning guide is to be followed.
- 2. 8 period schedule with 3 eating groups. Students in attendance all 5 days.
- 3. Masks will be required
 - a. Masks will be worn at all times based on the <u>Governor Dewine's mask order</u> of 8/4/2020:
 - b. A student will not be permitted to enter the building without a mask.
 - c. Extra masks for occasional forgetting can be available.
 - d. Students that refuse to wear a mask will be sent home.
 - e. Discipline for insubordination will be assigned for refusal to wear a mask.
- 4. Increased number of eating groups to three.
- 5. No PLP to help decrease movement of students and to allow for additional eating groups
 - a. Grading policy to be amended
 - b. Bi-weekly club schedule to be developed.
- 6. Student drivers remain in their own car in the mornings until the 7:17 bell.
- 7. Bus riders social distanced in the building 6 lobby and the cafeteria after exiting the bus
- 8. Cell phone pockets to be eliminated
 - a. Phones to be turned off or silenced with student
 - b. Phones may still be confiscated for failure to follow the usage rules
- 9. Field trips are cancelled.
- 10. Visitors are not permitted without a prior appointment

General Information:

- 1. WCCC students: When waiting for the morning or afternoon bus, please sit in the assigned seats in the cafeteria.
- 2. Lunch:
 - a. Students will be notified of eating groups on the first day of school.
 - b. Students will be assigned seats for each lunch period. Students are permitted to choose where they sit originally and then the seats become assigned.
 - c. Students must remain in their seats during the entire lunch period.
 - d. Students will be released by table to get in line for lunch.
 - e. Markers will be on the floor for standing in line for lunch.
 - f. Cafeteria staff will enter student pins so students do not touch the keypad.
 - g. There will be an extra amount of trash cans throughout the cafeteria.
 - h. Students will be released for trash.
- 3. Cooking and eating in class: Students are permitted to cook in class, but must only consume what they cook.
- 4. If a student has a medical condition that may prevent them from wearing a mask, the following protocol must be followed:
 - a. Get a note from your doctor
 - b. Take the note to the Washington County Health Department
 - c. If the health department determines the excuse to be legitimate, bring the excuse from the health department to the school.
 - d. Note: the school will not accept notes directly from a doctor. The note to the school must be from the Washington County Health Department.

- 1. All criteria from the planning guide is to be followed
- 2. Students in attendance all 5 days.

 - a. Masks will be required in the hallways.
 - b. Students will be required to walk in a single file line and follow the arrows.
 - c. Extra masks for occasional forgetting will be available
 - d. Discipline for insubordination can be assigned for refusal to wear a mask
- 4. Students will social distance and have assigned seats at lunch.
- 5. Bus riders will remain on the bus until the 7:20 a.m bell.
- 6. Car riders will be allowed to enter the building and go straight to their lockers and then socially distance in the gym by grade level. Reminder, parent drop off is now located behind the elementary school building by the soccer field.
- 8. Cell phone pockets to be eliminated
 - a. Phones to be turned off or silenced with student
 - b. Phones may still be confiscated for failure to follow the usage rules
- 9. Field trips are cancelled for the first semester.
- 10. Visitors are not permitted without a prior appointment and must sign in at the office. Visitors must wear a mask.

At this time, you should have created an account on the Parent Portal for your student. Use the <u>www.warrenlocal</u>. org website to answer any questions about Parent Portal Account Setup.

Please log into PowerSchool on September 4th to see your student's assigned classroom teacher. You will also receive an email from the teacher inviting your student to the "Google Classroom" that will be utilized by them this year.

School Fees for all K-4 students will be \$40.00 and payable through the "MySchool-Bucks" platform or through the school office. This is also the platform you can pay for school lunch through.

Elementary students will start school on Monday, September 21. Start time will be 9:10am with a tardy bell at 9:15am. School will dismiss at 3:40pm. Early dismissals should be of an emergency type basis. Pick-up tags will be issued for students that will be transported to and from school by mail after compiling data from the Transportation Survey.

Directions will be forthcoming on how to bring Student Classroom Supply materials to school.

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, we regret there will be no Open House this fall. We will have ample staff support during the first week of school to assist students once they enter the building.

"Final Forms" will be the platform the district will use to replace all the paper copies you used to fill out at the beginning of every school year. You will receive an email with directions on how to complete this process prior to the start of school.

We are very excited to welcome our students and staff into a new school. Even though this year may be significantly different than what all of us expected, we will work hard to make it as positive of a learning experience as possible for all.


Summer Improvements

Although the new buildings have occupied center-stage during their ongoing construction, the district has undergone many capital improvements over the summer.

Warren High School's Building-6 experienced several improvements. The mini-gym has been newly painted and boasts new flooring. The gymnasium, mini-gym, and weight room all have a new LED lighting retrofit. This upgrade includes some amazing features: event lighting may be scheduled, turning lights on and off electronically, as programed; lights may be dimmed during events, as needed; phone apps will allow maintenance personnel access to help troubleshoot from anywhere; and myriad other options.

New sanitizing foggers were purchased for the buildings and bus garage to help fight the spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19).
