This spring we are preparing to launch our new partnership with FinalForms. FinalForms will allow parents the convenience of enrolling their child from the comfort of their home. As long as you have a valid email address and device connected to the internet you no longer need to take the time out of your day to physically enroll your child with us.

Once we launch, a text alert will be sent to encourage parents to begin the enrollment process. Besides completing the enrollment paperwork, you will also be able to complete bus registration, and sports physicals with FinalForms.

We do understand that some may not have reliable internet access. In August, we will have computers available at each building for anyone that wishes to use them.


