

Band Courses



Marching Band

This class is mandatory for all PVHS students who are enrolled in any of the groups below. The Marching Band, also known as the Wildcat Brigade, performs at all home football games, certain away games, competitions in Southern California School Band and Orchestra Association, California State Band Championships (CSBC), and Bands of America (BOA), as well as parades in Perris and Temecula. Some exceptions in enrollment may be made for members of the Jazz band rhythm section, and is to be at the discretion of the band director.

Concert Groups- Concert Band, Wind Ensemble, Jazz Band

The band is divided into several smaller performing groups based on ability and/or grade. Throughout the year, these groups perform individually in SCSBOA music festivals and in scheduled concerts. Wind Ensemble and Jazz band are audition-only groups for students who have participated in the program for at least 1 year. Certain exceptions can be made if the ensemble lacks instrumentation, but an audition is still required.

Winter Percussion

At the discretion of the instructional staff, the Winter Percussion group will perform at various venues sponsored by the Percussive Arts Society (PAS) and at home concerts. With continually increased parent support and involvement, it is possible to have a competitive Winter Drumline group. This group will be enrolled in 0 period 2nd semester.

Color Guard

During the marching season, the Color Guard participates with the Wildcat Brigade at all rehearsals, field shows, home football games, and parades. At the end of the first semester, the Color Guard Staff will select, by audition, the students who will perform in the Winter Guard. The Winter Color Guard will perform at various competitions sponsored by the Winter Guard Association of Southern California (WGASC), West Coast Winter Guard (WCWG), and/or Winter Guard International (WGI). This group will be enrolled in 0 period 2nd semester (0 per. hours completed after school).
