**KWKT (Key Words at Key Times):**

- The District needs to update its Unusually Hazardous Plan (UHP) with the opening of Sun Prairie West High School.
- The District contracted with Traffic Analysis and Design, Inc. (TADI) to develop an Unusually Hazardous Transportation Plan for all secondary school (6-12th grade) boundary areas.
- Since the Board approved the Plan on September 27, 2021, Administration has held additional meetings with city officials for review and with the community for their feedback.
- The District recommends delaying implementation of the Transportation Plan until fall of 2023. This provides the opportunity to review actual traffic data against projected data with the opening of Sun Prairie West High School.

**History:**

On September 27, 2021, the School Board approved an updated Unusually Hazardous Traffic Plan and asked for subsequent follow up on two components of the plan. On January 24, 2022, the School Board confirmed the plan but delayed the implementation of two components by one year so the new traffic patterns could be analyzed with the opening of West High School and the change in boundary traffic patterns. We asked Transportation, Analysis & Design, Inc. (TADI) to revisit their analysis this past fall with the new traffic patterns. They have informed us that their study conducted in the Fall of 2022, after West High School opened, did not change their original recommendations.
