Department of Rehabilitation

What does the Department of Rehabilitation do?

The Department of Rehabilitation (DOR) assists Californians with Disabilities obtain and retain employment and maximize their ability to live independently. Vocational rehabilitation services are designed to get Californians with disabilities prepared for employment and can include training, education, transportation and job placement.

Should you apply for DOR VR Services

Do you have a disability? Student with a disability or Adult with a disability?

Are you having trouble getting or keeping a job because of your disability?

Do you believe vocational rehabilitation services would help you obtain or retain a job?

Do you want to work?

If you answered, "**YES**" to all these questions, you may be eligible for DOR services.

If you are an SSI recipient or SSDI beneficiary, and want to work, you are presumed to be eligible for DOR services. What happens once you have applied Once you decide to apply for services, you will be contacted by DOR staff to schedule an initial interview with a DOR Counselor.

Next steps:

- Determine eligibility: counselor will carefully evaluate & determine eligibility for our services within 60 days
- Informed Choice working with DOR
 - Develop Individualized Plan for Employment (IPE) 90 days from the eligibility determination date

Elements of Individualized Plan for Employment (IPE)

Agreement between Client and DOR and Developed with Consumer and DOR Counselor



Includes: Employment goal. Timeline for completion of IPE with an End Date



What are the reasons for choosing the employment goal; taking in consideration person unique strengths, resources, priorities, concerns, interests, abilities, and informed choice.



What is the job market or employment outlook for the person employment goal



What steps are needed to reach employment outcome



What services are needed



How will progress be measured and set up time for progress



Document other resources to help pay for costs of plan services if available

What services may be provided

- ✓ Counseling and Guidance help identify career goals
- ✓ Referrals
- ✓ Skills and interest assessment
- Vocational and other training services
- ✓ Job search & job placement assistance
- Transportation (bus pass/gas money) to participate in services

- Review of progress to stay on your goal
- ✓ Interpreter services
- ✓ Occupational licenses
- ✓ Supported employment services
- ✓ On-the-job training
- ✓ Rehabilitation assistive technology
- ✓ Clothing

Customized and Supported Employment (SE) DOR and Regional Center Clients

Customized Employment may take the form of:

- Matching job seeker's interests, skills, preferred tasks and conditions for success to the needs of a business
- Focusing on Interests, Skills, Tasks, Vocational Themes, Ideal Conditions of Employment, Employer Engagement

What is Supported Employment?

- Referral starts with San Diego Regional Center to a SE agency then to DOR
- Ongoing support (usually through a job coach) which gradually fades but may continue as needed

What Makes Supported Employment Different?

Place and Train Model


- Consumers are placed /trained into a job and begin working.
 - The individual learns and performs the job with the support of the job coach while working.

Ongoing Support Services:Getting the job is half the battle. Keeping the job is what makes SE different.

- Specialized Job Placement
- Job Coaching
- Other Services



Supported Employment – Prepare for and keep employment



The DOR Counselor may work with Supported Employment Agency to help consumer understand that agency role and Supported Employment process.

San Diego Regional Center works with youth and family to find the right supported employment agency for job development, placement, and coaching before coming to DOR.

Getting Started

- Complete a Contact Request if you would like more information about DOR

Complete a Student Services Request or Request for Services (Employment Services); an interested person can receive both Student Services and Employment Services (must meet criteria for Student Services)

3. If possible, provide/bring information to verify disability

4. If found eligible, we will contact you for an appointment to explore employment
