- Put aside other topics and work so you are ready to focus on the discussion at hand.



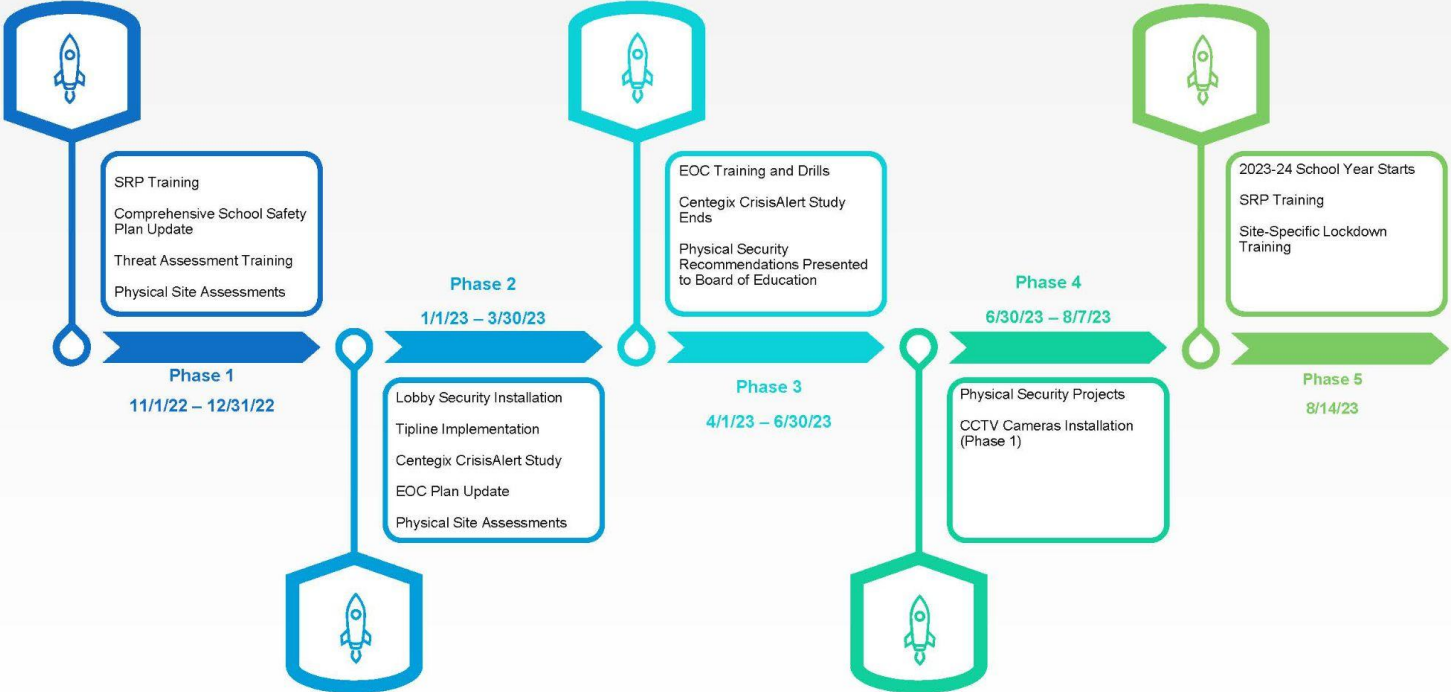

“I Love U Guys” Training Plan

- **Phase I: Standard Response Protocol (SRP) Training - All Staff (Certificated & Classified): November 1st**
 - 2-hour virtual training
 - Support to Principals prior to the training
 - Request to be trained before their staff is trained
- **Phase II: Lockdown Training**
 - CMPD & NBPD
- **Phase III: Standard Reunification Method (SRM) Training**
 - Training for reunification team and backups
- **Phase IV: Drills and Exercises**
 - SRP reinforced and practices through CSSP drills and exercises
 - SRM drill scheduled and conducted after training



Integrated Electronic Security System Standards

Standardize electronic security systems and hardware for future security projects. In order to identify a specific system, the board must approve a district standard per the Public Contract Code.

- Integrated electronic security system criteria
 - Surveillance cameras
 - Electronic access control
 - Intrusion detection
- Timeline:
 - Bid open Winter '22/23
 - Determination of district standard Winter '23
- Incorporate district standard in physical security assessment



Lobby Security

- **Lobby Security**

- Provide secure entry to school lobby during school hours
- Active monitoring and access permission before entering campus
 - 32 campuses

- Timeline:
 - Contract for design - October 10
 - Scope of work development - Fall '22
 - Bidding - Winter '22/23
 - Bid award - late Winter '23

- Coordinate installation beginning Spring '23

Threat Assessment

- Proposal to adopt the [Comprehensive School Threat Assessment Guidelines \(CSTAG\)](#), the only evidence-based threat assessment protocol
- Training through OC School Mobile Assessment and Resource Team (SMART) through the OC Sheriff's Department
 - One full day of training
 - Offer 4 to 5 different date options for identified site staff to choose from
 - Recommended team size from is 5 people per site.
- The following staff would be trained:
 - Principals
 - Assistant Principals
 - Admin Interns
 - Elementary Counselors
 - Secondary Counselors
 - School Psychologists
 - Elementary Behavior Specialists
 - Secondary Behavior Specialists
 - Special Education Behavior Specialists
 - General Education School Social Workers
 - Special Education School Social Workers
 - Campus Safety
 - SROs
 - Select Directors and Coordinators



Centigex CrisisAlert™

Emergency alerting system that empowers staff with the fastest and easiest way to call for help in emergencies, from the everyday to the extreme.

Two Types of Alert:

1. Staff Alert (3-click): medical emergencies, fights, elopement, etc.
2. Campus-Wide Lockdown Alert (continuous clicking): immediate visual and audible notification throughout school site.

Important Features:

- Wearable one button activation
- Immediate notification
- Total facility coverage
- Audio & visual notification
- Location accuracy
- Ease of installation
