

Annual Discipline Performance Report

Texas statute requires every district to publish a report on violent or criminal incidents at their schools. This annual report must include a statement of the number, rate, and type of violent or criminal incidents that occurred on each district campus, to the extent permitted under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974.

Any student who, while on the premises of a school or while attending a school-sponsored or school-related activity on or off school property, becomes a victim of one of the violent criminal acts listed below is considered to be a victim of a violent criminal act.

Student safety is always a top priority in Klein ISD.
