A HISTORICAL OVERVIEW OF THE BOYS' LATIN SCHOOL OF MARYLAND

Founded in 1844 by Evert Marsh Topping, a professor of Classics at Princeton University, The Boys' Latin School of Maryland is the oldest non-sectarian school in the state of Maryland. From 1844 until 1960, the School was located in downtown Baltimore and was operated by a succession of headmasters as a business. In 1960, Boys' Latin almost ceased to exist, as the School's Brevard Street location was scheduled by the city for demolition as part of urban renewal. The School's owners at the time decided to cease operations rather than undertake the rigors of relocation.

The three owners had, however, underestimated the impact Boys' Latin had made on Baltimore's educational and professional landscapes. Boys' Latin Alumni were leaders in the private and civic sectors of the Greater Baltimore metropolitan area and beyond. A movement began spearheaded by then-President of the Alumni Association, Jack H. Williams '38, to preserve the tradition of Boys' Latin. A lengthy search for a new campus site was undertaken, monies were hastily solicited and collected, a Board of Trustees was named, and the School was incorporated as a non-profit institution. Thirteen acres in Roland Park, the Cooper Estate, were purchased. Without missing a single semester, Boys' Latin opened in the fall of 1960 at its present location on West Lake Avenue.

In the last 63 years, the school has grown tremendously in terms of population, campus and curricular offerings. In September 2022 the school opened with 625 boys in grades K-12, a marked increase over the September 1960 enrollment of 120 in grades 1-12. Boys' Latin's campus has grown in that time from one building to encompassing both sides of Lake Avenue that includes a 28-acre property that is home to our boarding school which launched in the fall of 2021.

As steady as the BL growth was, no single event put the school on "Baltimore's map" more so than the 1964 Championship Lacrosse season, when our little 'David' of a school took on the 'Goliaths' of the MSA (the present MIAA) and emerged as victors! Boys' Latin had indeed arrived and has worked hard on staying there ever since. Boys' Latin began playing varsity lacrosse in 1929 so this year marks the 94th anniversary of Laker Lacrosse. Championship victories in 1932 and 1934 were not followed with another crown until 1964. The Lakers again won Championships in 1966, 1985, 1988, 1997, 2002, 2006, 2014 and 2021. Since relocating to Lake Avenue, Boys' Latin has reached the "A" Conference Championship game more than any other league opponent - 25 times! While it is virtually impossible to predict the season outcome when competing in the country's most competitive conference, one thing is for certain: The Lakers will play hard with a confidence that comes from a program that demonstrates excellence and sportsmanship time and time again.

Boys' Latin School has grown dramatically in its 179-year history. Though its face may be different – no longer at its downtown location or one-building school of the early 1960's – BL remains the same. The School led the way in building its overall program on the precept that individual attention can benefit boys of differing economic, social and intellectual backgrounds. The success of our students and the accomplishments of our graduates offer eloquent testimony to the continued merit of this philosophy.

BOARDING PROGRAM AT THE BOYS' LATIN SCHOOL OF MARYLAND

The boarding program's credo at The Boys' Latin School of Maryland is that no boy ever stands alone – especially our boarding students.

Beginning in fall of 2021, Boys' Latin offers an immersive seven-day boarding experience. BL has welcomed boys from all over the country and around the world into our school, our homes, and our hearts.

In 2020, the school purchased 28 acres of property contiguous to our campus from the Josephite Order. The property included a state-of-the-art housing facility which BL has converted into 20-bedroom suites capable of housing 40 students – two students per room. Each room is nearly 300 square feet and includes a bathroom with shower.

Boarding fits seamlessly into BL's mission and represents a bold new chapter in our storied history. And, because it's designed from the ground up, our curriculum incorporates the latest innovations in both residential and all-boys education – helping us raise boys who thrive in a time when it has never been more challenging or more important.

The program builds in weekly dorm meetings, group dinners, and the opportunity to mentor our youngest Lakers, ensuring that our boarders are part of our BL community. The weekends are a busy time for boarders. The campus often bustles with athletic competitions, and numerous other BL events and activities. A plethora of activities are planned for each weekend, including everything from going out for breakfast to visiting museums in Washington D.C. to a ski or tubing trip in the nearby Pocono Mountains. Each of our boarding students is paired with a day student family for a home-cooked meal, a movie night, or a game at Camden Yards. This is just one more way of integrating boarders into our BL family.

At Boys' Latin, each and every one of our students is known -- for who he is today, and all he will be tomorrow.



BOYS' LATIN LACROSSE HISTORY

CELEBRATING THE 35th ANNIVERSARY OF THE 1988 CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM

Boys' Latin was a talented team in 1988. Coach Bob Shriver's team had John Webster, Kevin Jedlicka, and Rife Hilgartner on attack. John Barcik and Keith Gertsen handled most of the face-off duties and were to run midfield along with Mike Lutz, Gene Ubriaco, Mark Moxley and Gary Blibaum. On defense BL would rely on Tom Taylor, Jeff Szczypinski, Randy Baker, and Luke Miller. John Hellman would handle the duties in the goal.

For the fourth time in five years the Loyola Dons and BL Lakers were going to face-off for the championship. Rain forced the game to be rescheduled due to the soggy field conditions at UMBC. Going into the game BL was ranked second behind the number one ranked Dons.

Playing before a huge crowd of more than 3,000 spectators, the Lakers and Dons played one of the most exciting championship games in recent memory. Both teams played a deliberate style during the first quarter feeling each other out and being cautious. Both schools' defenses were also very stingy. The goaltending on both sides was outstanding. Loyola took a 5-3 lead with 10 seconds left in the first half and seemingly possessed all of the momentum going into the halftime break.

However, at the start of the second half the Lakers managed to grab the momentum back when they won the opening face-off. They eventually came within one goal at 5-4 when Kevin Jedlicka scored on a great feed from John Webster. Loyola captured the momentum right back when they broke up an attempted clear and scored on a one-on-one situation against goalie John Hellman.

Loyola eventually went up by a score of 7-4. Most in the crowd believed the game was over since the Dons were known for maintaining their leads and winning games. The Lakers then went on a three-goal scoring spree and tied the game at 7-7. BL took its first lead of

the game with 5:50 left in regulation when Michael Lutz scored on a bounce shot from in front of the goal. The final minutes were frantic ones with both teams running up and down the field trying desperately to maintain possession of the ball. The clock finally ran out on the Dons, and the Lakers won their second championship under Coach Bob Shriver.

Shriver's strategy in the game was to isolate the play, be aggressive, and challenge the Dons' man-to-man defenders. Five of the Laker goals were unassisted. The Lakers outshot the Dons 17-9 and controlled six of nine face-offs in the final two periods. BL's defense, led by Jeff Szczypinski and goalie John Hellman, held on in the frantic final minutes to secure

the victory. "We isolated a little, and we were able to take advantage," Shriver told The Baltimore Sun. "We also had some nice transition in some unsettled situations."

Webster was sensational with two goals and two assists. Lutz had two goals and Jedlicka had a goal and an assist to lead the Maroon and White. The eight BL goals were the most goals scored against Loyola all season.



After the game an elated Bob Shriver told The Baltimore Sun that this was the biggest victory in his career as head coach. "I think back over the years and I remember our championship in 1985 and that was great, but this year we're playing the number one team, a team that hasn't lost all year," said Shriver. "This is great." BL's victory over Loyola denied the Dons the chance to become the first "A" Conference team since Calvert Hall in 1972 to go through the season undefeated.

John Webster finished the season with 39 goals and 38 assists. He was awarded the C. Markland Kelly trophy and became the second father-son winners and the first father-son combo representing the same school to win the prestigious honor. (Mick Webster won the Kelly Award in 1955). Webster also was named Player of the Year by The Baltimore Sun.

Coach Shriver, when asked about Webster, told The Baltimore Sun, "He is a very important part of our team. Probably John's finest asset is that he is a terrific team lacrosse player and I have never seen him quit on a lacrosse field." Shriver later wrote that John's great speed and outstanding stick work "single-handedly kept [BL] in some games and won others."

Defenseman Jeff Szczypinski was selected as a first team All-Metropolitan selection along with Webster, and Bob Shriver was selected as The Baltimore Sun's Coach of the Year. Michael Lutz was selected to the area's second team. Goalie John Hellman, midfielder John Barcik, and defenseman Tom Taylor were named Honorable Mention All-Metro selections. BL's defensive unit only allowed 5.3 goals per game during the season.


The Lakers finished the season ranked number one in the region with an overall record of 13-3.

BOYS' LATIN VARSITY COACHES AND STAFF



A 2006 Boys' Latin graduate, **Brian Farrell** enters his eighth year at the helm of the Lakers. Brian entered Boys' Latin as a 6th grader in the fall of 1999 and had an outstanding career both academically and athletically at BL. A member of the National Honor Society, Brian was a three-sport star who was captain of his football, basketball, and lacrosse teams his senior year. The 2006 Boys' Latin lacrosse team was undefeated, 21-0, and the consensus #1 High School team in the United States. That year Brian was named a High School All-American Defensemen and was a 1st Team All-Metro Player in *The Baltimore Sun*. Brian continued his lacrosse career at

the University of Maryland following in the footsteps of his father Mike, Maryland class of '76 and a National Lacrosse Hall of Famer. Brian had an outstanding career at Maryland with many accomplishments: he was a two-time United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA) Scholar Athlete, a three-time USILA All-American, an ACC Tournament Champion, and winner of the prestigious Charles P. McCormick Award as the Baltimore Area Athlete who contributed the most to athletics at the University of Maryland. Brian also had a solid career playing in the MLL (he retired from the Ohio Machine in 2015 to concentrate on coaching the Lakers). Brian's coaching career began at the Bridgeton Academy in Maine. He returned to his alma mater in 2013 serving as Maryland's Volunteer Assistant Coach and spent 2013-2015 coaching football and lacrosse at the Salisbury School in Connecticut. Brian brings a wealth of athletic acumen and experience to the job and has had the benefit of learning the game of lacrosse from some of the most respected teachers/coaches in the country: his father Mike, Bob Shriver, Steve Dubin, Dave Cottle, John Tillman and Bobby Wynne (Salisbury School Head Coach). In addition to coaching lacrosse, Brian works in the school's Admission's Office concentrating on the Upper School. Brian lives in the Lutherville Timonium area with his wife Jamie and daughter Ellie.





Tano Arrogancia is starting his 18th year on the varsity staff. Tano is as accomplished and knowledgeable a lacrosse coach as our area has. The former Head Coach at Pikesville (Pikesville won the '99 state "B" title) and former assistant at Hereford and St. Paul's, Tano has extensive experience working with goalies and face-off men. Tano has established a reputation as one of the most sought-after goalie tutors in the Baltimore area, and is a tireless

worker as a member of the Maryland State Lacrosse Coaches Association (MLSCA). Additionally, Tano previously was on the staff of perennial MLL powerhouse the Chesapeake Bayhawks. Tano will once again work with our goalies and face-off personnel.







A Baltimore native, **Myles Cohen '15** returns this spring for his fourth season with the team. Myles was a member of the 2014 National Championship team. As a senior, he was named "Most Improved Player," totaling 52 wins and just six losses in his career. Myles was also a starting defensive back and wide receiver on the varsity football team. During his time on Lake Avenue he was named to the honor roll and won the Jack H. Williams Award, honoring the student that is most caring and shows the most benevolence. Myles continued his lacrosse career at Furman

University where he was a four-year starter and is currently third all-time in career ground balls for the program. Myles graduated in 2019 with a Business Communications degree. Myles will help coach the overall defense and man-down defense for our team.

Brad Jones brings over 25 years of playing and coaching experience to the field. He helped the Severn School advance to the 2001 semi-finals as the Admirals earned a National Top 20 ranking and a coveted spot in the MIAA A playoffs, and joined his teammates at The Mount in its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 2003. In 2007, while residing in Nevada, Coach Jones founded a non-profit to accelerate the growth of lacrosse on the West Coast. Beginning in 2012, Coach Jones began a nine-year run as a coach with his alma mater, the Admirals. He served as the offensive coordinator for the Varsity program through the 2017 season,

setting school points records in 2016 and 2017 and helping the Admirals to advance to the MIAA A semifinals in 2016. He has served as the head coach for the Hungarian National Lacrosse team since 2016. As a player-coach he led the team to their first international victory at the 2016 European Championships, where the team went 5-5, including an undefeated run through the placement round. At the 2018 World Championships he coached Hungary to a 28th place finish. Coach Jones resides in Towson with his wife, Amy, and their three sons: Jamison, Henry and Bowden. He enjoys playing field and box lacrosse in his free time.



Tim Rotanz is returning for his 2nd season on the varsity staff. Tim is a very accomplished player from Wading River, NY who played collegiately at the University of Maryland. During his high school career Tim was a Under Amour All-American and a five-year letter winner at Shoreham-Wading River HS. He helped the Wildcats to three straight Class C championships and was named the MVP of the 2012 New York Class C Championship. Tim earned All-Division accolades five times, All-County four times and All-Long Island three times. He followed his high school career up with a stellar run at the University of Maryland. He was a captain, two time All-American and

a member of the Terps 2017 National Championship team. Tim also spent time coaching in the college ranks at Marquette University as well as Long Island University. We are lucky to have Tim on the sidelines helping with the offensive development of our young men. When he is not coaching the boys, Tim is a Howard County Police Officer.





Lewis Scharff is beginning his 16th year working with the varsity squad. He has provided invaluable assistance running our winter weight lifting and running program as well as working in the offseason with the midfielders. In the fall of 2013, Coach Scharff took over the reins of the BL Cross Country team. In Coach Scharff's five years with CC they only lost one regular season meet, won three varsity championships and one JV

championship. Coach Scharff (Head Coach), along with Coach Arrogancia head up the Lakers when we compete as a team during the summer at the National High School Lacrosse Showcase. Lewis will be in charge of running the defense along with Coach Sifford and Coach Cohen. Lewis, a graduate of Salisbury University, is the parent of former BL student athletes Adam, class of '08 and '12 graduate of Bates College, and Jimmy '11.



Wallace Sifford, a longtime coach for the Boys' Latin football program, has become a fixture on the Laker lacrosse sideline. A Baltimore native, Coach Sifford was a track star at Baltimore City College and the University of California at Berkeley. Coach Sifford has been a steadying influence for all our players and has a keen eye for the individual needs of each and every member on the team. Wallace helps in all facets of the game but concentrates on

defense. Coach Sifford is loved and respected by the players and enters his $14^{\rm th}$ year working with the varsity. Coach Sifford will be named an Honorary Alumni this spring at our homecoming ceremonies.

Michael Williams is returning for his third year on the Boys' Latin varsity staff this spring. Michael grew up in southern Maryland and attended South River High School. He played in college at Syracuse University where he helped the Orange win a National Championship in 2009. He started his coaching career as the head varsity lacrosse coach at Shady Side Academy in Pittsburg, PA. In his short time at Shady Side, he led his team to a Western

Pennsylvania Championship in 2014. Michael then moved north to the Millbrook School where he became their program's head coach and was also a college counselor for five years. Michael brings a wealth of knowledge to the game as well as a passion for coaching and working with young men. He has worked alongside Coach Farrell for many summers as a National Director for Trilogy Lacrosse. Michael is the director of our boarding program and lives in the dorms with his wife Emily and their twin boys Beau and Mac.



Dr. Shelly Pruett, Head Athletic Trainer, is a 1993 graduate from Towson University where she received her B.S. in Physical Education with a concentration in Athletic Training. Shelly then worked for ten years as Head Athletic Trainer at the Friends School of Baltimore and Rebounders Gymnastics. For part of those ten years she also worked in clinical settings throughout the Towson area. She completed her Masters and Doctoral Degrees in Exercise Science and Health & Human Performance in 2006 and 2010 respectively. Shelly spent six years as the Clinical Coordinator and an instructor in the Athletic Training

program at West Virginia University before moving back to Maryland. She has worked many lacrosse camps and Maryland Select lacrosse tryouts through the years. Shelly started at Boys' Latin in August 2015.



Chris Kury, Boys' Latin's former Athletic Trainer from 2000 to 2015, is currently the Middle and Lower School Trainer while also teaching Lower School PE. Chris has continued to work with upper school sports, especially lacrosse, as his time dictates. Chris received a B.S. in Physical Education (Athletic Training concentration) from Towson State University in 1995. Chris worked at Towson Sports Medicine performing Outpatient Physical Therapy for six years and was the Head Athletic Trainer at Calvert Hall College from 1994-2000. Greg had physical size and the athletic ability to be recruited for lacrosse and football college scholarships. He was fortunate to be offered an athletic scholarship to play SEC football at the University of Georgia. Greg started forty games and was an All-American Offensive Lineman. Earning his degree in Human Development and Family Science reinforced his interest to work with children in a coaching and mentoring capacity. After finishing college football and having the opportunity to be coached by many of the best coaches in the country, Greg played in the NFL for the Buffalo Bills and Arizona Cardinals. Greg believes that the experiences while playing sports and lessons learned on the field are valuable tools in the development of a young person. 



Prior to 1998, this award was presented to the "Best Player in the MIAA/MSA". Since then, it has been awarded to the "Best Player in the State of Maryland."




2022 KELLY AWARD WINNER DOM PIETRAMALA '22

Last May, Dom Pietramala '22 became the 14^{th} Boys' Latin player to win the C. Markland Kelly, Jr. Award, given each year to the "Best Lacrosse Player in the State of Maryland." Dom finished an impressive HS career earning All Metro honors, twice a HS All-American, twice recognized as a MSLCA All-State player, played in the Under Armor All-Americans, and is now one of the BL top ten scorers of all time.

2022 TEWAARTON AWARD WINNER LOGAN WISNAUSKAS '16



Last June, attackman **Logan Wisnauskas** '**16** was the recipient of the Tewaaraton Award, given every year to the best college lacrosse player. (This award is similar to college football's Heisman Trophy.) This marks the second time in four years that a BL Laker has won the award. **Pat Spencer** '**15** won it in 2019.

This past season Logan finished second in the nation in points per game (5.94) and goals per game (3.44) for the University of Maryland. After putting up four points in the NCAA Final, for a total of 103 points in 2022, he finished his Maryland career with at least one point

in all 75 of his NCAA games. Wisnauskas also had 14 hat tricks, setting a Maryland-record with 40 in his career. He set numerous additional records while at Maryland: points in a season (103), goals in a career (205), and points in a career (340).

Logan took home an NCAA Championship and is ranked fourth all-time in career goals and eleventh all-time in career points for all NCAA Division 1 men's lacrosse players. In addition, Logan was named the winner of the Lt. Raymond Enners Award, given annually to the NCAA's most outstanding player in men's college lacrosse. The award is presented by the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA) and is named after 1st Lt. Raymond J. Enners, who attended the United States Military Academy, class of 1967, and was killed while serving in the U.S. Army during the Vietnam War. Pat Spencer won the award in 2019. Current BL Board of Trustee member **Joe Cowan H '21** was the first recipient of the award in 1969.

Logan was the top pick in the 2022 PLL Draft, joining the Chrome Lacrosse Club. Logan is now working with the men's team at High Point University.

BOYS' LATIN LAKERS IN THE LACROSSE HALL OF FAME

CLAXTON J. "OKEY" O'CONNOR

Claxton J. "Okey" O'Connor was elected to the Hall of Fame in 1964. He coached the Boys' Latin lacrosse teams from 1931-1960. His BL lacrosse teams won MSA "A" Conference championships in 1932 and 1934 and annually were always near the top of the standings. Okey played lacrosse for Baltimore Poly and later played on the 1930 St. John's College National Championship team. O'Connor was a mathematics teacher, football and basketball coach and part owner of Boys' Latin School until its reorganization and move to Lake Avenue in the fall of 1960. Okey was inducted into the Boys' Latin Athletic Hall of fame in 2006.

JOHN F. KELLY

John 'Jack' Kelly graduated from Boys' Latin in 1933 and was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1969. He was the goaltender for the first Boys' Latin Championship team (1932) and was an All-Maryland selection at his position. Kelly took his skills to the University of Maryland, and the Terps lost only one game during his three years in the goal. He was a 1st Team All-American selection in 1936 and 1937. Jack was inducted into the BL Athletic Hall of fame in 2006.

HOWARD "HOWDY" MYERS, Jr.

'Howdy' Myers, a 1929 graduate of Boys' Latin, was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1971. An outstanding football and basketball player at Boys' Latin and the University of Virginia, Howdy is best known for his legendary coaching abilities, and is credited for the rise of lacrosse on Long Island. In his 46 years as a coach (1933-1979), his teams compiled a lacrosse record of 379-141-6. Myers is responsible for establishing the St. Paul's (1936-46) lacrosse program – under his leadership the Crusaders had a 135-18-2 record. In 1946, Howdy took his skills to Johns Hopkins, where from 1947-49 the Blue Jays went undefeated, and winning three national titles. In 1950, Howdy became the athletic director, head football and lacrosse coach at Hofstra, where his lacrosse teams had a 180-115-3 record. Howdy was inducted into the BL Athletic Hall of Fame in 2006.

JAMES McC. WEBSTER

James 'Mickey' Webster, a 1955 graduate of Boys' Latin, was the first Laker to be honored with his induction into the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in 1977. While at Boys' Latin, Mickey earned All-Maryland honors three years ('53, '54. '55) at attack and won the C. Markland Kelly Award his senior year. Upon graduation, he continued his education at The Johns Hopkins University, where he was a three time All-American ('57, '58, '59). His sons John '88 and Ned '94 have added much to our lacrosse program. Mick was inducted into the BL Athletic Hall of Fame in 2006.

DONALD P. HAHN

Don Hahn was a 1947 graduate of The Boys' Latin School and was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1981. Donny was also one of BL's greatest athletes of all-time. As a Laker, Don was selected to the first team All-Maryland lacrosse squad in 1945 and the only unanimous choice in 1947. He broke his ankle in the spring of 1946 but still was selected to play in the 1946 MSA Lacrosse All-Star game. Don was captain of the 1947 Division II championship lacrosse team that lost to Gilman in a thrilling title game 7-6. Later that spring he received the Maryland Officials' Association Award as the best lacrosse player in the MSA. Don went on to attend Princeton University. In the spring of 1951 he finished his remarkable college lacrosse career at Princeton and was named first team All-American at attack for the second straight year leading the Tigers to the national title. In 2006 he was inducted into the BL Athletic Hall of Fame.

JOSEPH S. SOLLERS

Joe Sollers, a 1947 graduate of Boys' Latin, was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1987. A High School All-Maryland selection ('44, '45, '47) in the goal, Joe was also the first recipient of the C. Markland Kelly Award in 1945. Joe continued his education at The Johns Hopkins University, where he was a three time All-American ('49, '50, '51). Joe won the C. Markland Kelly Award in 1951, given annually to the best college goaltender in the nation. Joe was inducted into the BL Athletic Hall of Fame in 2006.

MILTON E. HILLIARD, Jr.

'Butch' Hilliard graduated from The Boys' Latin School in 1964 and was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1988. At Boys' Latin, he was a three-year varsity member and was selected to the 1st Team All-Maryland squad in 1964, for his efforts in the goal. Butch took his skills to Cornell University, where he became a two time All-American ('67, '68) for the Big Red, and was a perennial "Club Lacrosse" All-Star from 1969-1979. Butch earned the Kelly Award in 1968. He was inducted into the Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008.

MICHAEL S. FEDERICO

Michael 'Piggy' Federico, a 1976 graduate of Boys' Latin, became the latest Laker to join the Lacrosse Hall of Fame with his induction in October 1999. At Boys' Latin, Mike was a three-year member of our varsity Lacrosse team, honored as a 1st Team All-Metropolitan player (1976) and was selected a High-School All-American his senior year. Continuing his education at The Johns Hopkins University, Mike started in the goal for the Blue Jays three seasons ('78, '79, '80), winning the National Championship each year, while compiling a 40-2 record. Mike completed his collegiate career as a three-time 1st Team All-American and a three-time recipient of the Kelly Award, given to the nation's finest goalkeeper. He was inducted into the BL Athletic Hall of Fame in 2012.

SIFFORD PEARRE. a 1901 graduate of Boys' Latin, and **WILLIAM H.**

HUDGINS, a 1902 graduate of Boys' Latin are both members of the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame. Both played at Johns Hopkins University and attended Boys' Latin before we began our inter-scholastic lacrosse program in 1929.
