Call to Order

The Chairman called the meeting to order at 6:28 PM

Pledge of Allegiance

Budget Deliberations and Final Motions

The Chairman gave a quick recap from the last meeting. Through a series of collaborative meetings with the department heads the board proposed a total reduction of \$1,419,011. He stated the Board of Education asked us to take a further look into the proposed amount.

Mr. Greenleaf stated they come to the board every 4 years for a computer replacement which replaces half of the school's computers. He stated they put \$50,000 into the capital budget that

would be set aside so the next time this comes around in three years they won't have to come back for debt financing. Mr. Greenleaf stated it's a \$285,000 four-year cycle with today's rates they would save around \$50,000 every time it comes out. HE stated it will not change the mill rate. Ms. Pignataro stated at the last meeting there were several cuts to the funding balance. With the reductions, they've been able to reduce the proposed mill rate. With the fund balance that was proposed, we were participating in taking a million out of the fund, now it's less.

Mr. Purcaro stated the second adjustment for consideration against what we disused last week was the Board of Selectmen's CCM membership. The first selectman provided the chairman with the benefits of this subscription including training opportunities, prescription drug savings, advertising for key openings, certification for staff members, etc. Mrs. Pignataro stated the finance department receives an executive summary each year from them which is critical to helping them push through work.

With these deliberations, the revised reduction is \$1,360,045 dropping the mill rate to \$1.8 mills.

This is a motion to reduce the following budget revenue accounts.
