

Tribal Language Programs







Dual Language Expansion

- 1) Implementation of dual language at elementary level:
 - 2026–27: 25 additional districts
 - 2029–30: 22 additional districts
 - 2040: Statewide implementation

\$4-5 million annual grant funding

- 2) Bilingual educator recruitment and retention:
 - \$5,000 annual stipends for bilingual endorsed teachers
 - \$1,500 annual stipends for bilingual certified paraeducators
- 3) All school districts provide high school students with the opportunity to earn the Seal of Biliteracy.
