SUPERINTENDENTS REPORT: Mr. Hermann reported on the RDA training he and a couple of staff attended last week in Pierre. The SD DOE provided help and training to the district for their RDA goals. He then gave an update on the building project. The concrete work is going well and should be completed in three to five weeks and the masons will be arriving soon.
