

Title I

What is it?

- Supplemental academic intervention funded by the federal government
- MASD receives federal funds to service students. We use the funds to provide reading intervention with certified reading specialists at our schools with the highest percentages of students on the free and reduced lunch program.
- MASD also contracts with the Allegheny Intermediate Unit to provide Title I services to our eligible students in non-public schools.

How are students selected?

- Acadience Reading, a universal screener
 - Students who show the greatest need are admitted to the program first, based on the Acadience Composite Score
 - Well-below benchmark
 - Below benchmark
- NWEA MAPs, a diagnostic assessment
 - used to corroborate Acadience data
- Classroom teachers may be consulted



Students exit the program when they meet or exceed the Acadience Reading benchmark standard



Intervention Program

- Targets students in grades K-2
- Intervention instruction is supplemental to the core reading program
- Progress Monitoring occurs regularly
- Acadience Reading testing
- Students exit the program when they meet the benchmark standards for their grade level.
- New students who meet the criteria are admitted to the program throughout the year.
