

Online Courses for NYS Students



AccelerateU Online Courses, 2022-23

AccelerateU offers 300+ online, asynchronous courses for NYS students. Our courses are facilitated by our teachers, with tech support provided by our staff.

Students work independently, guided by due dates and weekly progress reports. We also offer online real-time tutoring for students in our Regents courses.

Our courses are NOT Zoom-based or taught in real-time.

Students work on their own, paced by due dates, with our teachers supporting mostly by email.

We offer single courses and entire classes to help alleviate teacher shortages.

Each one-semester course costs \$754 per student. Enrollments dropped within the first 7 days are not invoiced. Enrollments dropped from 8 to 28 days are invoiced at \$50.

AccelerateU course costs are aidable.

AccelerateU meets NYSED Part 100.5d10 requirements for online and blended learning.

Course Costs, 2022-23

Each semester (.5 credit) online course costs \$754 per student.

Examples: Health is a semester (0.5 credit) course and costs \$754.

Spanish 1 is a two semester (1.0 credit) course and costs \$1,508.

AccelerateU is an aidable service. Districts receive BOCES aid on the purchase of each course in the year following purchase. For example, the actual cost for a course for a 70% aid ratio district is \$222.30.

Early withdrawal fee

0-7 days: no charge for enrollments dropped in this time frame.8-28 days: charge of \$50 for enrollments dropped in this time frame.

Invoices are sent monthly from September to July.

Local BOCES fees may apply.

Late enrollments – in May and June - will be invoiced at full cost of \$754, regardless of completion/drop status.

For any district interested in servicing a full class, there will be a 10% coordination fee

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Protecting Student Information

New York State Department of Education Ed Law 2d requires districts to protect students' personally identifiable information (PII). PII includes information that can be used to distinguish or trace an individual's identity either directly or indirectly though linkages with other information, such as student name, parents' names, student address, and student number.

We work diligently in reminding everyone to remove PII in all communications. For example, instead of using full names for students, we recommend using first names or just initials.

The online platform and content vendors we work with have access to PII, so we require them to sign our Ed Law 2d contract, which specifies acceptable data protection, handling, and retention practices.

AccelerateU Student Contract

With each enrollment, students receive a confirmation email. By taking the course, they agree to the following rules.

Students: By taking your online course, you agree to the following:

- Follow your school's Code of Conduct and Acceptable Use Policy (AUP)
- Work in your online course 3-5 times per week for at least 3+ hours per week
- You may be withdrawn if you fail to log in for two consecutive weeks
- Communicate with us regularly and respond to emails within 24 hours
- Never copy anyone else's work or provide answers to anyone
- Never use online language translation programs
- Cite the works of others if you use permitted Internet sources.
- Refrain from intimidation, harassment, bad language, and bullying

First incident- email warning with a copy sent to guardians and the school

Second incident - possible removal from course, resulting in failure

For severe incidents, immediate removal from course

Registering Students

Enrollments are requested online in our system (Genius Class), http://accelerateu.org.

Step 1: Click on Students tab and Add Student.

Fill out ALL information. Much of it is required by NYSED.


Click **Save**. Go to student's profile – by the "Click here" link, or by going to the **Students** tab and clicking on the student's name.



Step 2: Select **Requested Courses** and **Add a new course request**.

Select the Term, Course, and Start Date. Choose Entry Reason and click on check boxes. Save.





AccelerateU staff will enroll the student within 24 hours and send a **confirmation email** with complete instructions and contact information.

Step 3: In the student's account, when necessary, upload any **IEP** or **504 document(s)** by clicking **External Files** and **Upload new file.**





How Online Courses Work

Students have 20 weeks to complete their course. Upon request, we can grant an additional 4 weeks.

Courses are online, available 24/7, wherever students have Internet access. Students work at a pace guided by suggested due dates. There are no videoconferences; students work asynchronously. They should work at least 3-5 hours per week. Our teachers monitor progress, clarify concepts, offer help, answer questions, provide grades, and report progress.

AccelerateU is not Zoom-based or real-time. It is an asynchronous supplemental online learning program.

When students complete the course, they earn NYS credit, awarded by their districts. All courses are monitored by NYS certified teachers.

Technical Support

The district is responsible to make sure its devices can access the Internet and our sites. **AccelerateU** provides second-tier support. We encourage students to reach out with detailed information concerning technical issues.

Proctoring Requirement

Students take midterm and final exams in a proctored setting at school. Midterm and final exams are password protected. District staff will be provided with this password. Please do NOT share it with students. This ensures test integrity. Homebound students can be proctored at home by guardians.

Plagiarism

It is important that students understand the severity of plagiarism. Students can ensure their work is not plagiarized by utilizing free plagiarism checkers such as www.quetext.com. We reserve the right to remove students after two occurrences of plagiarism.

System Requirements

AccelerateU's online courses have video, sound, and interactive elements. Because technology changes frequently, we recommend running this computer system check regularly and following its recommendations on updating your system: https://browsercheck.qualys.com/.

Students need access to a modern computer with an Internet connection and updated software plugins. A headset with microphone is required for world language and other courses to record voice assignments. All students will need district email accounts for communication purposes.

We do NOT recommend iPads, tables, or smartphones for online course work.

Frequently Asked Questions

Will the course have a teacher?

Yes. All our courses are led by NYS-certified teachers. They communicate with students on a regular basis, mostly by email. They respond to questions within 24 hours (school days only).

What do students do if they need help?

The district is responsible for technical support to ensure its computers can properly open AccelerateU courseware. AccelerateU provides second-tier support. For academic support, students contact their online teachers. For other support, students contact their counselor.

How can districts best support their online students?

Designate a local advisor - someone to meet with students regularly and monitor progress. We encourage advisors to contact us to discuss progress and issues. It's best to add as much structure as possible, such as scheduled time for online work, an active advisor, peer group, teacher assistant, lab assistant, and a tutor, if necessary.

How quickly will the teacher respond to questions?

Most of our online teachers also teach during the day. They respond at night and complete grading over the weekends. In most cases, teachers will respond within 24 hours. Students are encouraged to consult other resources and move on in their course while waiting for answers.

What about hands-on science labs?

Some of our science courses require hands-on labs, supervised by qualified staff. This must be implemented and documented locally by the district.

How is test security handled?

Students take midterm and final exams in a proctored setting at school. Midterm and final exams are password protected. District staff will be provided with this password. Please do NOT share it with students. This ensures test integrity. Homebound students can be proctored at home by guardians.

What about IEP or 504 Plan modifications?

If a student has modifications, please attached the IEP or 504 Plan to their account in our system. The district is responsible for most local modifications.

What about Regents and AP Exams?

Districts are responsible for administering, ordering, and paying for exams. Our courses have final exams, and at the districts' discretion, we can substitute an exam for a Regents exam.

Tech Issues Logging in to AccelerateU

Please use a Windows PC, Chromebook, or Macintosh for course work.

Other devices like cell phones and tablets do not always work well.

Use Google Chrome as the browser. If Chrome is not available, use Microsoft Edge.



- Select "Always allow pop-ups and redirects from..."







- Move the slider to allow pop-ups and redirects








Roles and Responsibilities

AccelerateU will:

- Provide access to online courses
- Provide access to student gradebooks if requested
- Provide NYS-certified teachers for the online courses
- Provide program awareness as requested by districts.
- Maintain records of student progress, evaluation, and time spent in courses
- Communicate applicable policies of participation, grading, and administration
- Provide second-tier technical support for course content.

The district will:

- Assign an advisor to help the student locally
- Retain responsibility for services required in IEP or 504 Plans
- Ensure student has access to a computer with Internet access
- Provide first-tier technical support
- Provide a proctored environment for midterms and final exams
- Administer Regents and AP Exams
- Arrange for hands-on Science labs, when necessary
- Grant credit to student's transcript upon course completion
