WHY BOARD ACTION IS NECESSARY As the governing body of the school district, changes to School Board policy must be approved by the School Board. III. BACKGROUND INFORMATION Current Policy 9000 is extremely old and does not adequately reflect the district's equity vision. The revisions rename the policy "Equity in Capital Projects" (current name is "Goals") and explicitly state our intentions to seek participation from a diverse array of contractors. This policy has been revised since introduction. Specifically, language about the vision of keeping contracts within the Highline community has been moved up, and language was added about student participation in capital projects where possible. IV. RECOMMENDED MOTION I move that the Highline School Board approve the revisions to Board Policy 9000. V. FISCAL IMPACT/REVENUE SOURCE Fiscal impact to this action is unknown, although no significant fiscal impact is anticipated. Policy No. 9000 School Facilities Page 1 of 1

It is the policy of the Highline School District that when using capital funds to build, repair, or maintain Highline facilities the district will actively strive to have inclusive business participation in contracting and procurement activities. Capital funds, specifically those from voter-approved bonds and levies, are funds that come from the Highline community, and the district's vision is that some of the contracts using those funds remain within the Highline community.

When soliciting bids for projects, the district will invite applications from qualified applicants, including women-owned, minority-owned, and small, local, and/or other disadvantaged businesses.

Recognizing that our schools are designed for our students, where possible we will seek student participation in our capital projects, including through the district's pre-apprenticeship programs.

This policy is in line with the district's Equity Policy, wherein we seek "to be a leader in being an anti-racist organization focused on eliminating racism, racial and other identity inequities, and institutional bias."

The district will comply with all applicable Washington State and/or Federal rules when conducting bidding, contracting, or other procurement activities using capital funds.

The board recognizes the importance that the physical plant plays in enhancing the instructional program. The district shall develop an aggressive program to maintain and/or upgrade the buildings and grounds of the district. Facilities represent a long-term investment of the district and the state. The functional utility of such facilities can be increased with a regular maintenance program monitored by staff.

The board further recognizes the importance of planning in order to provide the facility needs of the future. Therefore, the district shall maintain a regular review of facility needs and conditions and of the demographic data which impacts the enrollment within the district.
