

Cul-De-Sac Information

The school districts' standard for travel on a cul-de-sac is that the street must be longer than .2 miles one-way. Even if the cul-de-sac is longer than .2 miles one-way there must also be enough room to turn the bus around safely (this means not backing back up the street like on a dead end street). This standard is applied across the district and exceptions cannot be made for any student unless there is a safety or medical issue that could override that standard. This standard helps the district to insure the safest bus routes possible, while still allowing for the most reasonably efficient busing system for the school district.

Despite the concerns about the distance a child must walk to the bus stop, as well as issues that might prevent seeing a child at the bus stop, district standards must be applied equitably for all students.
