#### DRIVER'S REGISTRATION FORM – PARKING PERMIT

Please click here to fill out the Parking Permit Google Form. Once the Google Form is filled out, students will bring their payment, driver's license, current student ID, as well as a signed RDT form to Schedule Pick Up on Wednesday, July 28th. You may also pick up a form in the main office if you cannot make schedule pick up day. Parking permits are \$40; C-9 student cost is \$20. Students applying for a parking permit must be on the RDT List (Random Drug Testing). RDT forms are available online at this link.

#### **TEXTBOOK FEES**

Textbook fees will average \$375 with iPad. Depending on the courses in which your student is enrolled, textbook fees can vary. Early College student fees may differ. Tuition fees for Early College students will be available on Skyward approximately the *third week of August*.

#### TEXTBOOK PAYMENT ARRANGEMENTS

After you receive your book rental statement, if you have questions concerning your student's statement or payment arrangements, please call Christle Beam, Treasurer, (317) 881-0581, ext. 4401. Book rental statements will be mailed in early fall.

#### STUDENT SUPPLY LIST

On the first day of class, each teacher will give students a list of specific supplies needed for their class. Most student supplies are purchased with fees paid at beginning of the school year. Students should bring pencils/pens and paper on the first day of school.

#### **MEAL PRICES**

Center Grove will offer free Breakfast and Lunch meals for the 21-22 school year, **free to all students** (you do not need to qualify or apply), a la carte items will be an extra charge. The Food & Nutrition Services Department will conduct the first Direct Certification upload from the IDOE during the second week of July. Once letters are printed and mailed, Skyward Family Access will be opened for families to apply for textbook assistance online (end of July). Please make note...paper applications will not be accepted this year. *Applications will only be accepted online through Family Access*.

#### RDT (Random Drug Testing) & DAT (Drug, Alcohol and Tobacco)

Freshmen planning to participate in extra-curricular (athletics, clubs, drama, student government) and/or co-curricular activities (band, choir) must complete the <u>Random Drug Testing (RDT) Consent Form</u>. Information regarding the Random Drug Testing (RDT) program and form is available online and at registration. Parent and student signature is required.

In addition to the RDT Consent Form, the Athletic Department and Music (*Band, Choir*) Department have specific code of conduct policies regarding drugs, alcohol, and tobacco. Students participating in athletics and/or band/choir must review the Drug-Alcohol-Tobacco (DAT) Policy Form linked <a href="here">here</a>. The form explains the rules and consequences for violations of the DAT policy.

#### CENTRAL NINE TRANSPORATION

Center Grove will provide transportation for all C-9 students when Center Grove High School is in session. It is also our expectation that students will attend all C-9 scheduled days for the 2019-20 school year. C9 classes are in the afternoon this year. Students will come to the high school for STaR class, have lunch and then bus to C9 around 11:10am.

#### ON SCHOOL DAYS, DOORS OPEN AT 7:00 A.M.

For the 2021-22 school year, CGHS doors will open at 7:00 a.m. *Students will not be able to enter the building until that time.* Parents dropping off students or students driving are asked not to arrive at the high school before 7:00 a.m. *Students will need to enter Door #9.* Staff members meeting with students before 7:00 a.m. will make special arrangements.

#### PHYSICAL FORMS

#### **ALL-SPORTS PASS**

#### 2021-22 SCHOOL IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

Indiana Law requires that students have an up-to-date shot record on file, complete with month, day and year of each immunization are required for enrollment.

HepB: The minimum age for the 3<sup>rd</sup> dose of Hepatitis B is 24 weeks of age.

DTaP: 4 doses of DTaP/DTP/DT are acceptable if 4th dose was administered on or after child's 4th birthday.

Polio\*: 3 doses of Polio are acceptable for all grade levels if the 3rd dose was given on or after the 4th birthday and at least 6 months after the previous dose.

be administered on or after the 4th birthday and

Varicella: Physician documentation of disease history, including month and year, is proof of immunity for children entering preschool through 12th grade. Parent report of disease history is not acceptable.

Tdap: There is no minimum interval from the last

MCV4: Individuals who receive dose 1 on or after the  $16^{\rm th}$  birthday only need 1 dose of MCV4.

Hepatitis A: The minimum interval between 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> dose is 6 calendar months, 2 doses are required for all grades K-12.
