# Goal of our presentation

# National Facts about Social Media and Teens

- ★ 55% of teens have given out personal information to someone they do not know, including photos and physical descriptions.
- ★ 29% have been stalked or contacted by a stranger.
- ★ ONLY 34% of parents check their child's social network sites.
- ★ 29% of teens have posted mean info, embarrassing photos or spread rumors about someone.
- ★ 24% have had private or embarrassing info made public without their permission
- ★ 22% have been cyber pranked.

## What kids think about social media parental controls

- 67% of teens say they know how to hide what they do online from parents.
- 43% of teens say they would change their online behavior if they knew that their parents were watching them.
- 20% of kids think their parents have no idea what they're doing online.
- 10% have unlocked parental controls to disable filtering.
- 39% think their online activity is private from everyone including parents.

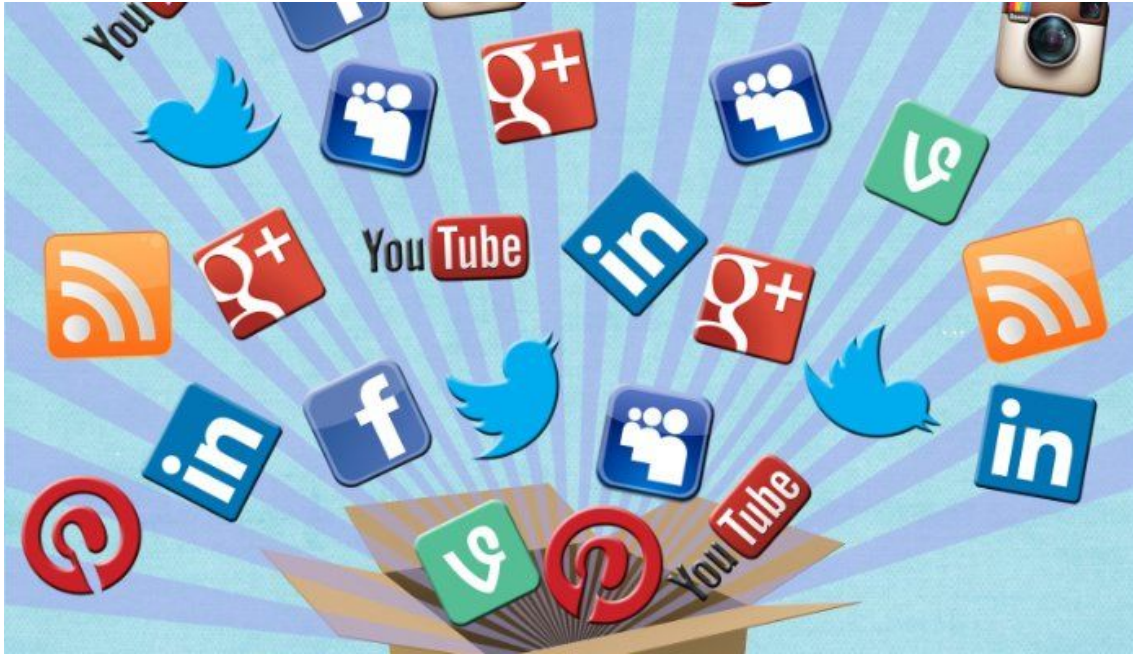
35% of our students responded “every chance I get” to how often they are on an electronic device

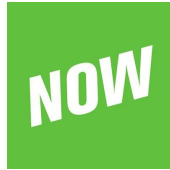

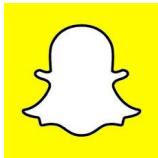

## Suggestions to help monitor your child's social media

- ★ Friend or follow your child on ALL of their social media.
- ★ Get the password from your kids for all apps and sites
- ★ Set parental controls on all electronic devices.
- ★ Educate your teen about these sites.
- ★ Explain the importance of being a good digital citizen.



## Suggestions to help monitor your child's social media

- ★ Restrict time and places kids can use their technology.
- ★ Be a good role model for use of technology.
- ★ Place computers in public areas.
- ★ Take their devices at night and charge in your room



# Sexting

- **40%** do it as a joke, **34%** do it to feel sexy, and **12%** feel pressured to do it
- **17%** of sexters share the messages they receive with others, and **55%** of those share them with more than one person
- **70%** of teen boys and girls who sext do so with their girlfriend or boyfriend, **61%** of all sexters who have sent nude images admit that they were pressured to do it at least once
- Nearly **40%** of all teenagers have posted or sent sexually suggestive messages, but this practice is more common among boys than girls

# Sexting

- Sending semi-nude or nude photos is more common among teens girls. **22%** of teen girls report sending images of this nature, while only **18%** of same-age boys have
- **15%** of teens who have sent or posted nude/semi-nude images of themselves send these messages to people they have never met, but know from the Internet
- **24%** of high-school age teens (ages 14 to 17) and **33%** of college-age students (ages 18 to 24) have been involved in a form of nude sexting
- Sending or receiving a sexually suggestive text or image under the age of 18 is considered child pornography and can result in criminal charges

# School Consequences

- When things happen on the internet and cause a disruption to the learning environment of our students then a school consequence might be given.

## Possible Consequences

- Warning
- Loss of technology
- Lunch detention
- Before/After School Detention
- Suspension
- Recommendation for expulsion

Consequences will vary based on each specific incident.
